All permanent moorage tenants have paid either their quarterly moorage or paid in full. The flood insurance for the Club has been cancelled and the club received a refund for 2013. A \$500 cash donation was made to Evergreen Elementary School earmarked for the outdoor camp held at the YMCA.

<u>Events Chair:</u> Tim Heitzeman invites more members to join the Events Committee because they have such a good time! Fingertips will be back to play again for the Memorial Day Dance. And the LIC was very lucky to reserve Kim Archer for the Labor Day Dance this fall. The next big event for the Club is the April 12 Garage Sale.

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that 42 years ago this month the very first formal meeting of the Key Peninsula Historical Society (KPHS) took place in the fellowship hall of the Longbranch Community Church. That meeting took place on April 27, 1972. Eventually the KPHS meeting location began rotating between the Key Peninsula Civic Center in Vaughn and the Longbranch Committee Church. In 1995 the KPHS got a more permanent home when its associated museum opened in the former Pierce County Library room at the Civic Center. Since that time, individuals from all over the Key have put in thousands of volunteer hours to help the KPHS preserve and display the amazing history of this peninsula.

The fund raising event held at the El Sombrero Mexican Restaurant on Monday, March 10, was another community-wide effort to help the KPHS with its important mission. On that night, from 5-9 pm, Pablo and Cathy De La Cruz contributed 10% of the till from both the dining room and the bar to the Historical Society. The event was planned as a way to acquire the funds needed to match a \$250 challenge grant given by a member of the community. The hope was that the 10% contribution would raise the money needed to match that grant, which would be quite an accomplishment, since Monday is not a big dinning out night. But, in the end, thanks to an amazing response from people all over the peninsula, the 10% contribution raised \$300, and an additional \$190 in donations were given by people at the restaurant or in lieu of not being able to make the event.

A great big thank you goes out to the LIC members that participated. During the 5:00 to 7:00 pm time frame, LIC faces made up the single largest contingent present. It was a fun night, with amazing community participation. And although we may have overwhelmed them a little bit, it was clearly a good night for the restaurant too.

By the way, make sure to take the time to stop by the KPHS museum in order to take a look at the newly created *Forest To Farm* exhibit.
