President's Message

I am not sure about you, but I'm happy to put the month of February 2019 in the rearview mirror! Whether you like snow or not, the weather resulted in a number of delays around the south Key Peninsula, including rehab work at the marina. We were able to complete the marina dock upgrades and close out the Washington

State capital grant; however, the electrical upgrades are taking longer than planned, but they are nearing completion. The good news is the marina electrical system will have a dedicated GFI circuit breaker for every outlet making it safer than before. We still need to complete maintenance on the fire system water line, so we have that protection back as soon as possible. Finally, we announced at the last membership meeting a new service offering coming this summer to the marina – kayak storage racks, so stay tuned about this new feature.

We are awaiting a schedule from the contractor that will do the refurbishing on the five large windows on the west side of the clubhouse. Sharon Gearhart will again spearhead coordination for this project as she's done in the past, so I know it'll come off without any glitches. The Pierce County Preservation Board grant is providing ½ of the funding for the \$22,815 project and we will apply to The Longbranch Foundation for additional funding of about ¼ of the total cost.

In addition, we are in the very early stages of exploring the possibility of applying for another Preservation Board grant this spring to cover about ½ of the cost for a structural engineer to evaluate the building's roof and foundation structure, and determine what additional load it could support. The interior of the roof is part of the historic nature of the building, so it cannot be covered with insulation. We can only insulate on the outside and then re-roof the building with an acceptable covering. Once feasibility is determined, TLF will apply to the State of Washington in 2021 for a capital grant.

On another Preservation Board note, we asked for and received permission to do the venting out the front of the building for the new tankless on-demand water heater that will be serving the kitchen. That work, which also encompasses a new propane tank and line into the building, together with some improvements to our audio/visual capabilities in the auditorium, all need to be completed no later than May 1st.

March is upon us and hopefully the snow is behind us! Let the Crocus and Daffodils bloom!



Recipe of the Month

Clark Van Bogart, president, called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

There were no guests or new members present.

BOARD REPORTS

Secretary: Jane Eiseman asked that the minutes of the January meeting be accepted as written and submitted. MSP.

Treasurer: Jim Hettinger announced that the numbers (the 2019 Budget Requests and Reserve Additions for 2018) approved by the membership at the last meeting have been entered. Permanent moorage figures for January are low but should rise in February. We are over budget for member dues.

President: Clark presented a Star Award to Carolyn Wiley, for extraordinary service in 2018. Life Time Awards were sent to Kerry and Helen Jamieson and to Jim and Katherine Olson.

A letter has been sent to the holders of promissory notes, reminding them of the option for early payment of the note. [The initial amount of \$106,000 is down to \$48,000].

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Membership: Nancy Carr put out a reminder that membership dues are owing as of January. If not paid by March 1st, the bylaws specify that members lose their privileges until thirty days after payment of dues.



Events: Bob and Barb Green reported that Suds N Spuds, which is to be held on March 16th from 5 until 8 p.m., has an excellent lineup; an emcee, music, Irish dancers, games etc. There will be dessert and beverage bars as well.

Sunshine Lady: Cheril Allen said that lots of people in our community have bad colds - wash your hands! She also told us that her daughter is having a baby girl.

OLD BUSINESS

Marina Grant: Clark thanked Jim Hettinger for wading through all the bureaucracy, and Robert Theisen for working every day at the Marina for the past five weeks.

The water line for the fire system broke and work continues on replacing that line.

He reported on new electrical problems with the four electrical panels at the Marina. The present electrical wiring will not work with the new GFI system, so additional conduit and wiring is necessary. The contract for re-doing the wiring is on a time-and-materials basis, not to exceed \$18,500.
