LONGBRANCH IMPROVEMENT CLUB GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES MARCH 16, 2011

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: Geoff Baillie, Kurt Anderson, Phil Johnson, Lynn Carr, Jan Prichard, Francie Carr, Pat Muchmore, Peg Bingham

CONTRACTORS PRESENT: Sharon Gearhart

Meeting called to order at 7:13 p.m.

Agenda presented and approved.

President Geoff Baillie introduced guest speaker Jerry Borchert from the Washington State Department of Health. His topic was biotoxins in shellfish. He presented a slide show and explained the different biotoxins found in saltwater in the state, myths and misconceptions about them and how to protect yourself from them. Jerry also brought handouts covering the same information. The LIC Secretary has a copy of these handouts and will be happy to provide copies to any member requesting them. The State does extensive testing of the waters and recommends that before you dig you check the DOH website at www.doh.wa.gov/biotoxinmaps.htm, call your local health department or the shellfish hotline (1-800-562-5632). Jerry said he was helped by volunteers, including the LIC's Doug Sylvers, in collecting mussels that are used for the testing.

REPORTS:

CONTRACTORS: No reports

PRESIDENT: No report.

VICE PRESIDENT: Kurt Anderson reported that Dave Mikelson presented a detailed report on a fundraising poker tournament he attended in Renton for the benefit of Little League and his vision of how the LIC could put on one. This type of event is used by many 501-C(3) organizations. His proposal was the LIC plan to do one in June of this year. The Board discussed this in detail and decided that as volunteer intensive as this would be that June would not be practical. The General Membership was asked if they are interested in this type of event and if anyone would volunteer to help Sandy research what permits are required from the state, how to plan it, what expenses are involved and if there are enough volunteers interested to work on it. If anyone would like to help or chair this event, please call Sandy Black (884-1309).

Kurt presented the Board's recommendation that the LIC have Tim Heitzman design two samples each of hats, shirts and windbreakers to be used to advertise the club. Tim will present them at the April General Meeting for approval. They would not have a logo but a slogan addressing the LIC's purpose of bettering the community. The items would be ordered ahead by members and others in the community and paid up front with a few extra of each Ordered by the club for samples.

TREASURER: Francie Carr reported that the club is ahead of budget by \$13,000. The last payment to Marine Floats was made last week. Members have until March 31st to make their second moorage payment.

SECRETARY: Peg Bingham asked to have the minutes from the February General Meeting approved. Motion made, seconded and approved.

EVENTS: Sandy Black unable to attend. Printed schedules on upcoming events were available on each table. Mojo Overload has been booked to play at the Memorial Day Dance on May 28th.

MEMBERSHIP: Jan Prichard reported there are 81 memberships paid. Tonight's raffle is the book "An Automobile Tour Through Key Peninsula History" and a basket of primrose plants. Jan would appreciate donations for future raffle items to be auctioned. The raffles will be held at dessert meetings and benefit the scholarship fund.

Jan thanked the evening's hostesses, Sharon Gearhart, Eloise Colbert and Ann Dearing. Trish and Dale Goodvin were at the sign-in table.

BUILDING: Lynn Carr asked for volunteers for the Building Work Party to be held at 10:00 a.m. both April 9th and 10th. There will be new driveway posts to be installed, the woodpile needs to be moved and there will probably be a bonfire to dispose of it. Also general cleanup in and around the building with hopefully the windows washed.

The meeting room furnace has been fixed and he asked for approval of an expenditure of approximately \$1,300 to update and recharge the fire suppression system on the kitchen stove. This repair is required by the fire marshal. This was tabled to be discussed under New Business. He also asked for donations to replace the antique refrigerator in the kitchen. The Freon in it cannot be recharged. It will have to be replaced with another commercial refrigerator to comply with county health department rules.

DOCK: Pat Muchmore reported that a very successful work party had been held at the marina with 16–18 people participating. The gate is up and a portion of the dock has been power washed. If anyone would like to power wash some more of the dock their help would be greatly appreciated.

Pat said that Dennis Carroll ordered the equipment for the security system and is hoping to have it installed before he leaves for a business trip in mid-April. Pat hopes to have the phone installed as soon as possible. There was a water pressure problem at the dock today, but it should be fixed tomorrow.

There were drawings of the new gate structure distributed on each table. Pat said a change to the drawings was approved by the Board. The drawings show the sani-cans and the garbage bin, one on each side of the entrance, but they will both be on the right side so that is not the first impression one would get of the gate area. Bruce Jeglum will be back in town by April 15th and plans to begin construction.

Dave Wickland thanked Harry for finding today's water problem. He said CenturyLink will be out again on Friday. He also announced that the gate is now working and for entry after it is locked an active card will be needed. A new card can be obtained for \$35 if yours does not work.

Geoff Baillie thanked Dave Wickland for his help with the contractors to make sure everything was finished as agreed.

OLD BUSINESS: Carolyn Wiley reported on the Feast or Famine event held on March 8th. Attendance was down but all who attended enjoyed the evening. All the numbers are not in yet, but it appears the Food Bank will receive at least \$2,000. She said many of the usual old members put in lots of time but were helped tremendously by some of our new members, who stepped in where needed and put in many hours.

NEW BUSINESS: Geoff asked for a motion to repair the stove fire suppression system. Motion was made and seconded. Motion approved. Geoff announced that Board elections will be held in June and asked for volunteers for a nominating committee. There were no volunteers at this time.

Geoff also announced that Robin Gould made a donation to the club in the memory of Don Jopp.

Francie reported that our insurance company sent a check for \$463 for the theft of the copper wire from the dock. Sharon Gearhart reported that she reported the cutting down and the theft of the wood of the old-growth cedar tree from the clubhouse woods. While we were given a case number, there is little chance the theft will be solved. The value given on the tree was \$1,500.

Geoff reported that the one adult in the building vandalism was ordered to pay restitution of \$37,000. This is to be divided between the LIC and the church. However, the LIC share was \$1,860, since much of the LIC losses were insured.

Raffle winners were Pat Muchmore and Larry Bingham.

Meeting adjourned at 8:38 p.m.
