After you buy your ticket, complete the registration process: Bid on a delicious array of desserts; Go to the AUCTION tab

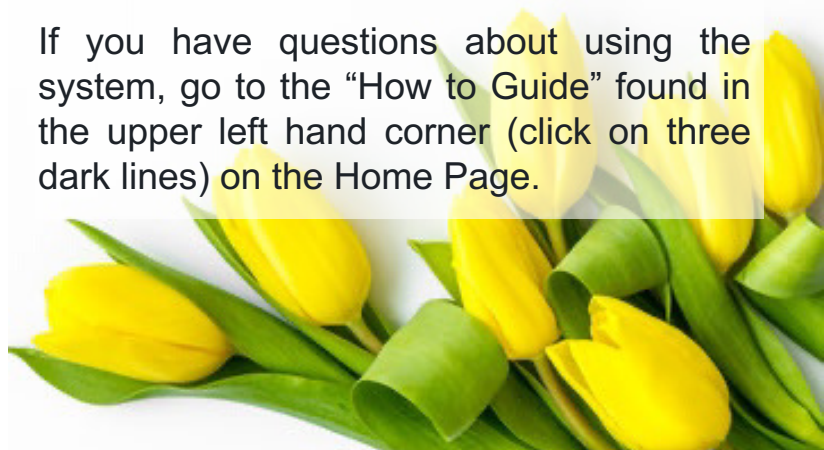
and click Desserts under Category. Bidding on desserts ends April 8.

Centennial Events Calendar

- April 10 Kicking off this Centennial Year is The Lonbranch Foundation's biennial charity auction. This virtual auction will benefit the ongoing South Key Peninsula community support and scholarship programs of The Longbranch Foundation.
- May 19 **Centennial Stories Part 1**
At the May Member Meeting a couple current LIC members are talking with long term LIC members about their recollections about special times and events on the South Key Peninsula and at the LIC. This will be Part 1 of a two part series.
- June 16 **Centennial Stories Part 2**
At the June meeting, Centennial Stories will continue with citizen stories of the fun and eventful history of the South KP and the LIC. Both of these Member Meeting "Centennial Stories" sessions will be recorded on video, so they can be used either in "live" face to face meetings or in virtual zoom meetings.
- July 17-18 **Centennial "Marina Days"** will be a two-day celebration at the Longbranch Marina of the LIC's place in the history of the South KP. Multiple events are scheduled this weekend with food and family fun activities. The LIC is bringing the Virginia V steamer, "an icon of maritime history" to the marina from Seattle. We will be selling tickets for the ride on the old mosquito fleet ferry from Tacoma. Ticket price will include a bus ride up to Foss Landing in Tacoma the morning of July 17th and a box lunch for the return trip to Longbranch. Buses will board and depart from the LIC Parking Lot at 9am. A shuttle will take riders back to the LIC Lot when they disembark around 1:30pm. That afternoon there will be live music, and for three hours Virginia V tours will be available while dockside at the marina. On Sunday, July 18, the celebration festivities will continue. Events will start at 1pm at the Longbranch Marina with a live local band and other fun activities. For tickets, see next page.

August 14-15 **'Centennial Weekend'** will feature lots of old-fashioned fun at the LIC. Saturday will have an LIC sponsored outdoor BBQ and Picnic. There will be races and contests, including a two-day Whiffle Ball tournament on the old diamond. Saturday evening there will be a dance with live music performed by local fiddlers. Sunday morning there'll be a fabulous LIC Brunch, and the weekend will wrap up with an Antique Car Show on the LIC grounds.

September 15 **The LIC Member Meeting** will feature a presentation by our new LIC Historian, Polly Robinson, about the history of the South Key Peninsula and the LIC.

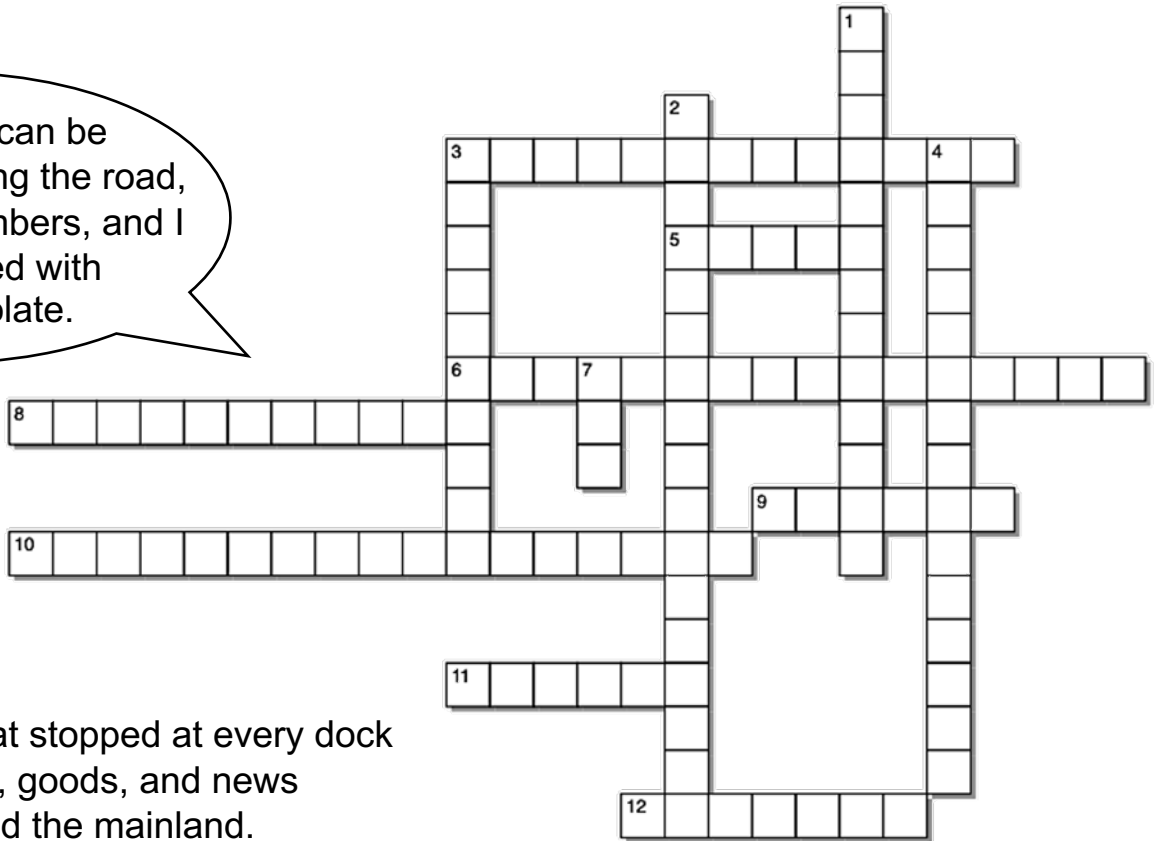
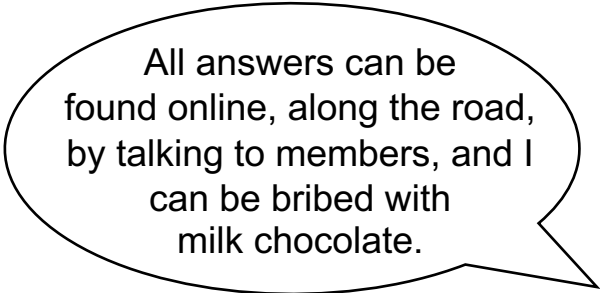
Step back in time aboard the Virginia V! The steamship, Virginia V, is one of only a couple remaining Puget Sound Mosquito Fleet Ferries. Built starting 100 years ago of local old-growth fir, she is fully functional still today. The Longbranch Improvement Club, in celebration of its Centennial, is bringing this old steamship ferry to the Longbranch Marina in July. For her July 17th run from Tacoma to Longbranch passenger tickets will be available, including a bus ride to Foss Wharf in Tacoma and a box lunch. That afternoon at the marina there will be dockside tours. The LIC will be hosting a private period party on Saturday evening aboard the historic Virginia V starting at 7:30pm. This party will benefit The Longbranch Foundation and its scholarship support programs for local South Key Peninsula kids. There will be heavy appetizers, 1920s, 30s and 40s period dance music and a cash bar on board. Join us for a whimsical evening party in mid-July aboard the Virginia V. The kids will benefit!

Building and Grounds Update for LIC Newsletter

First of all, thanks to all the volunteers who showed up Saturday for the spring cleanup. They hauled items from the container into the building, trimmed bushes, cleared the blackberries and debris from the side and back of the building, and weeded the beds. A special call out to Mike Fay who mowed the whole lawn with his John Deere.

Inside, Mary Lemon, Ann-Marie Ugles and Jan Brown cleaned the kitchen and storeroom. Unfortunately, they found an infestation of mice in the storeroom, which meant cleaning everything. So far, we've been able to trap four. Please be careful about leaving any food scraps outside the building to avoid further problems.

We will schedule more work parties in the future as we need to compost the beds and put bark on the south side of the building among other things. We'll also organize a trail repair party.

Many of the toilets have been replaced in the women's bathroom, as they were not working properly. Luckily, they were on

recall so there was no cost to the LIC. Thanks goes out to Jason Reese at Truewater for his plumbing work.

The Health department tested the water for nitrates and bacteria; it is fine. The refrigerator was also fixed (it was low on refrigerant) and the furnaces were serviced.

Jeff Tritt is helping us paint the container (and got donated paint from Benjamin Moore) this weekend. And Jim is meeting a representative from Fircrest doors and Bart Wolfe next week to look at designs to replace the front door.

A special thanks to Mary Lemon for her years of leading the kitchen. Ann-Marie will be taking over for her.

Secretary: Sheryl Low asked that the minutes of the February 2021 Membership Meeting be accepted as written and submitted. MSP

Treasurer: Review of the February 2021, financials by Jim Hettinger. We are over budget \$1,400 for February, which is good for the month.

Membership Reminders: When you enter your volunteer hours, and if you are working for another non-profit, put that info at the beginning of the hours. You will get credit for our organization towards your hours total.

Buildings and Grounds: Water samples were submitted for testing. Four toilets in the Ladies room were replaced as they were under recall. One of the urinals will be repaired. We are looking at replacing the front door. We will be looking for volunteer carpenters to help install the new door when we have it. Spring clean-up is this Saturday at 10 AM. We would like to move all of the stuff out of the container, so that we can start painting the container. The stove will be repaired tomorrow, for easier lighting. Jeff Munch will also help with fixing the irrigation system in April.

Marina: One finger pier on B dock needs to be fixed so new floating tubs will be installed. The gate is repaired and there is a new lock and security system. WAVE is going to be installed to improve internet service at the Marina. Opening day is planned for May and will be limited to members only. Opening day merchandise will be available, so please contact Jennifer Guyler if you would like to purchase anything.

Members can sign up for a bus ride to Tacoma during the morning, and then ride the boat from Tacoma to the Longbranch Marina. This will include a box lunch and the cost will be \$100.00 per person. Saturday afternoon there will be tours of the boat, and a party on the Virginia V will be auctioned off at the April event. This event will have live music.
- August - There will be a two-day event at the LIC, Aug 14, & 15, which should be fun, and will include a whiffle ball tournament. Good Old Fashioned picnic games and lots of fun. Saturday night will include a dance at the LIC. Sunday morning, there will be a fabulous LIC brunch. There are also plans for an antique car show.
- September - The LIC Historian will make a presentation.
- Community Garden Proposal: David Shinnars explained his proposal for a Community Garden at the LIC. He would like to develop a community garden on the property of the LIC to help the community and provide for those in need. The vision is to create a

garden plot at the north end of the property that is currently unused. There is already water sourced close to the location. The plan would be to give away the produce we grow. There might also be a pea patch side that individuals could rent to grow their own produce. There is also a vision to use the garden for community outreach and educational opportunities. We could potentially partner with The Mustard Seed to offer spaces and assistance to those aging who would like to continue gardening. We could have a pumpkin patch in October to provide every child a pumpkin with our Trunk or Treat event.

- Pumpout Update: A hearing is scheduled for April 14, 2021 for approval by the County.
- Preservation Grant: We have been slated to receive a \$25,000 grant to continue the preservation project of the roof. We are still waiting for the final approval by the County.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 pm

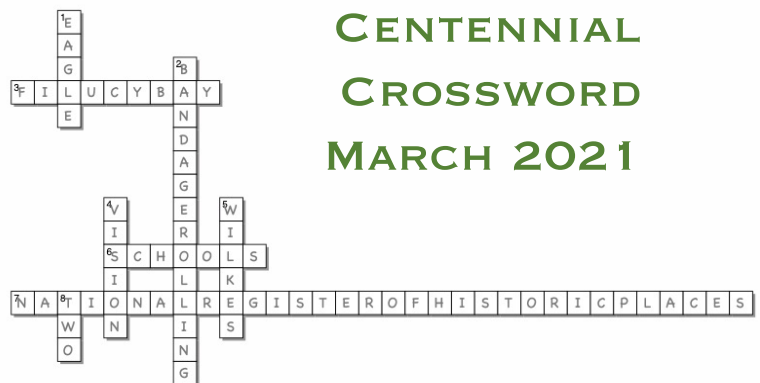
