In this time of uncertainty, our education committees continue to push forward to understand what we can do to help our students.

Student Programs: The Fifth graders at Evergreen Elementary attended their Environmental Camp experience this year with financial support from TLF, and Hygiene Kits that were put together by Jan Prichard and her crew. The Student Programs committee has met and is working with Evergreen to see if there is anything we can do while students are out of school, and then how we can best support them once school starts again.

Higher Education: Don Berger and his committee had plans to review high school senior applications for scholarships this month as well as review letters from our recurring scholars. Don reports that we have received letters from four of our recurring scholars, and he is working with the Peninsula Hawks on when and how to review high school senior scholarship applications in light of the current restrictions.

Our support to the community recently included a \$2,000 grant to Food Backpacks 4 Kids. As you know, FB4K continues to supply backpacks on Saturday to community children while school is closed. And, as a point of information, the Key Peninsula School District is supplying free breakfast and lunch to students, so our kids do not go hungry while school is closed.

Our support to the Clubhouse, and the Engineering Study for our new roof, is severely restricted with the postponement of the Super Sale. As you know, we need to match 50% of the grant we received to do this study. The proceeds of the Super Sale, currently rescheduled to June 13, will help pay for our half of this Engineering Study.


