

Earthquakes and Volcanoes of the Pacific Northwest

The LIC will sponsor a talk on "Earthquakes and Volcanoes of the Pacific Northwest" by Dr. Jeff Tepper of the University of Puget Sound on Thursday, October 6th at 7:00 PM. Dr. Tepper's research has centered on the dynamics of the molten rock (magma) that lies under the earth's crust, and how this coupled with movements of the earth's crustal plates generate both earthquakes and volcanic eruptions. These are global phenomena (as recent news from Japan, Haiti and Iceland underscore) but have special relevance to those of us living here in the Puget Sound region. The talk is open to the public.

LONGBRANCH IMPROVEMENT CLUB GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES August 17, 2011

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: Geoff Baillie, Kurt Anderson, Francie Carr, Jan Prichard, Sharon Gearhart, Sandy Black, "CC" Williams

NEW MEMBER: Jack Kennedy

The meeting was called to order by President Geoff Baillie at 7:07 p.m.

Geoff introduced our newest member Jack Kennedy and thanked Virgil and Norma Iverson for serving as host and hostess for our meeting.

REPORTS:

Treasurer: Francie Carr reported that our gross income is still ahead of budget. The LIC received \$6.17 in restitution from one of the delinquents. Our total expenses to date remain below expected budget amounts. The Croquet Tournament enabled the LIC to send a donation in the amount of \$1881 to Communities in Schools Peninsula. The bar net proceeds of \$326 is revenue for the LIC. Although all the expenses are not yet in for Beyond the Borders, the gross food proceeds were \$525 plus \$10 in performers' script. The bar gross proceeds were \$820. Today Francie took \$30,000 from the LIC checking account and put it into a 3 month CD which will earn interest of .15 percent.

Geoff reported that Mike and Denise Hays put down a \$100 deposit for their \$10 a day 5-day rental and are donating the extra \$50 they would have gotten back to the LIC Scholarship Fund. In addition, they have donated \$250 to the Scholarship Fund in appreciation for being the vendor at the Croquet Tournament.

Membership: "CC" asked for members who worked at the Croquet Tournament to please contact her to verify their hours. She has many folks listed on the volunteer sheet with the time they started volunteering, but very few signed out, so she doesn't know how long they worked. Hours can't be recorded until she gets that information. Also, she is sending out all member emails, but is aware that some members aren't getting them and she is working on it.

Building and Grounds: Sharon said the grounds are looking good and thanked folks for helping. She is putting together a Building and Grounds Committee and has two volunteers. Anyone else who is interested please contact Sharon. One of the committee's goals is to clean out items that are no longer of any use. Broken chairs in the storage room will be repaired or salvaged for parts. Dayna Hanson is looking for LIC members to be extras in the movie she is shooting at the LIC on September 1st. She has a band playing and needs dancers. Look on the LIC website for information. The building is completely rented for August and most weekends in September.

Marina Committee: Denny Prichard, standing in for Randy Babich, reported that a lot of ice is being sold at the dock and he's looking for volunteers to be on a list of folks willing to go get ice at the Shell station when Pat Thompson, our dockmaster, notes that we are down to just a few bags. Anyone who goes to get ice will get \$5.00 for their trouble. Lynn Carr, with help from Tom Kelly, has installed a light on the flag pole. Sandy Black has finished the wiring for the security system and the security system is now working properly.

An adopted Tlingit, she has collaborated with master Nuu-chah-nulth artist Art Thompson to create robes with a southern coast influence in order to introduce artists from all nations to weaving using their own tribal styles and personal influences.


