Treasurer's Report:

and the proposed 2010 budget. After discussion, the 2010 budget was approved as submitted.

By-Laws:

Phil Johnson gave a brief history of the most recent efforts to amend the LIC by-laws and a summary of the proposed revisions to the by-laws. The first reading of the by-laws was had and discussion was held. Interested members are asked to attend the next general meeting where motions to approve, amend, etc. will be taken.

Dock Report

We are continuing work on the water system at the dock. A group of dock committee members met for a work party and fixed many of the water line problems caused by the previous cold snap. The Otto Water system has had the entire of main lines replaced and shortly after we discovered some severe leaks at the dock that drained the system. There still seems to be a slight leak somewhere on the dock system and we will be addressing this later this week.

Permit requests have been made with the county for replacing the lines under the road to remove them from the culvert and we are just waiting for county approval. These will be upgraded to a 2" line from the meter to the dock. This should remove any question regarding our water being potable.

We have installed new motion activated lights at the dock in several locations including spotlighting the dinghy dock area as well as dock A and D. A big thanks to Kelly Oathout for the entire installation. They are not all working properly and we will be adjusting them to get them working properly.

Once we are confident that the water lines are not leaking, we need some help to pressure wash some areas as the dock is extremely slippery due to the mildew buildup.



Just a reminder to keep your area clean by your boat. It is an easy task to scrub the boards with salt water and a scrub brush. There is one located in the broom closet that works great for this.



If anyone is looking for hours, please contact Dick Van Cise as we need help to re-attach the safety netting running along the boathouses.
