GENERAL MEETING MINUTES
FEBRUARY 15, 2012**

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: Geoff Baillie, Randy Babich, Jan Prichard, "CC" Williams

CONTRACTORS PRESENT: Lynn Carr

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 by President Geoff Baillie.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Marlies Van Cise announced that she is taking a group to Iceland in September and invited anyone interested to contact her. Tim Heitzman announced that we are raising money for our kitchen so we can buy a new refrigerator. Four raffle baskets donated by Christine Tritt were on display and raffle tickets are \$2 each. The "coffee basket" will be raffled off at the meeting, and the other three at the Pancake Breakfast on March 3rd. The Pancake Breakfast is "all-you-can-eat", drinks are no-host. Contributions to help fund the kitchen makeover will be gratefully accepted. Geoff directed everyone's attention to the new stove and counter which were recently installed. Geoff presented Mary Mazur with her Lifetime Award certificate.

SPEAKER: Geoff introduced member Mike Hayes, President of the Key Peninsula Parks & Recreation Foundation, which exists to raise money for the Parks District and to preserve the areas timber lands. The Foundation is a 501c3 charity and has a six member Board of local people. In an effort to preserve our forested land, the foundation is working on different ways they can help landowners in need of funds to find alternatives to clear cutting. They have access to trusted independent legal and financial advisers who can also assist with setting up a land/asset donation, a charitable remainder trust or a lifetime estate. Though the Foundation is very new people are already responding to their mission and have donated over \$10,000. Mike invited everyone to let people know about the Foundation and its mission. SECRETARY: Jan Prichard, Secretary, asked for approval of November's minutes. A motion was made, seconded and approved. She also asked the members to pick up a calendar of events.

TREASURER: Francie Carr, Treasurer, was absent but left a written report as follows: **Revenue:** Members are paying their moorage dues. There are several checks dated January 31 that will be deposited next week. Winter moorage revenue is ahead of the projected budget. **Expenses:** The building fuel bill was far more than expected for January. The liquor permit for twelve events has been purchased. The down payment for the fall Shibori Workshop has been sent. The 2010 and 2011 interest payments for all promissory notes have been mailed.

MEMBERSHIP: "CC" Williams, Membership Chair, Reported that we have 196 members including 26 Lifetime Members. Please let her know about any hours you've put in for the Club so she can keep current records.

BUILDING AND GROUNDS: Sharon Gearhart, Building and Grounds Chair, was absent but left a written report. The old kitchen has been renovated with a new stove and wood counter with a stainless steel top. Many thanks to the membership for voting to fund the new stove and counter, to Peg Bingham for coordinating and cleaning, to Bruce Jeglum and Jim Lemon for designing and building the counter and to Lynn Carr for procuring the countertop. Many volunteer hours were donated to make this project happen. The gray water system has been fixed and thanks goes to Geoff for knowing the right people to get the job done. Sharon asks that kitchen helpers go easy on our aged septic system by scraping all dishes thoroughly before rinsing them and putting them in the sanitizer. The winter storm did not damage the building, but did quite a bit of damage to trees. Bill Lloyd and Doug Lewis did a lot of outdoor cleanup. There are still limbs to be cleaned up in the back if anyone is looking for volunteer hours and has a chainsaw. The new furnace in the meeting room was not doing an adequate job and Kohler came in and sealed leaks and cracks and added a new vent and vent covers which has helped tremendously. Sharon would like to restore the horseshoe pits and would like to hear from anyone willing to help with that in the Spring. Please call her at 884-3890. There will be building and grounds cleanup the end of March or the beginning of April and she will be posting a list of needed tasks in the newsletter.

MARINA COMMITTEE: Randy Babich, Marina Committee Chair, reported that, after a good deal of research by Pat Muchmore, they have decided to do five wine tastings with cheese and crackers at the dock this summer. The hope is to lure in yacht clubs and possible make a little money. There is a broken conduit at the dock, some of which is five feet under the water. There are five options to choose from at a great range of price. He will be polling the marina committee and the Board to come up with the preferred solution so that the electrician can begin work. Randy also urged boaters to pay their moorage fees if they haven't already done so. There are around 27 applicants totaling \$1.5 million in funding requests for marina pump outs/restrooms and only \$300,000 is available. The Wi-Fi is now working thanks to Denny Prichard. All the marina signs have been put up. Bill Buckner has donated a small chest freezer and the large ice freezer currently on the dock will be going to Tacoma to be put up for auction.

EVENTS: Carolyn Wiley passed around a sign-up sheet for folks who would be willing to clean up after the Pancake Breakfast on Saturday March 3rd. Anyone who wishes to work in the kitchen must have a food workers card from the Tacoma/Pierce County Health Department which can be obtained online. On March 31st, the Friends of the Key Center Library are sponsoring the Taiko Drummers who will be performing at the LIC. There will also be art and origami demonstrations and hands-on opportunities. Liquor permits and event permits have all been purchased and all written so that minors can attend all LIC functions.

Denny Prichard talked about the Garage Sale on April 14. Members can purchase indoor space for \$20 or outdoor space for \$15 to sell items for their own profit. Members are also encouraged to donate items for the LIC to sell. There will also be a Baked Food Sale and Shirley Brewer is in charge of that. Members are encouraged to bake as many items as they like as long as the items need no refrigeration. Contact Shirley Brewer at 884-0787. Baked goods may be dropped off Saturday morning between 7:30 and 8:45 a.m. on April 14th. Donated items can be dropped off at the LIC on Thursday and Friday, April 12th and 13th between 3 and 8 p.m. If you need your donations picked up, call Prichard's at 884-2030. Volunteers are needed for the Garage Sale and signup sheets were passed around.

Geoff announced that Vicki Biggs is our new Sunshine Lady.

HISTORIAN: Lynn Larson, LIC Historian, presented two notebooks she has finished for the years 2010 and 2011. She will be maintaining the LIC archives and will continue to put together yearly notebooks. She thanked members who have contributed information and photos and encouraged members to continue to submit articles and photos and let her know the photographers names so she can give them credit. She would like help with organizing photos received on electronic media. She does not use Facebook so asks that people put photos on a CD instead. Eloise Colbert is our new Office Volunteer. She has started inventorying everything in the file cabinets and putting it all on a spread sheet. Lynn will be interviewing some of our long-time members and former members and Vicki Biggs will help transcribe those interviews.

NEW BUSINESS: Andy Gano presented an idea for reciprocal moorage between yacht clubs and the LIC Marina. Andy is a past Commodore of the Carling Yacht Club and in 2006 he floated the idea of members coming to Longbranch, paying for their moorage and then billing the yacht club for the amount. His goal is to get other Yacht Clubs who don't have reciprocal moorage to offer it and so get more boats to come into Longbranch.

OTHER BUSINESS: Ann Dearing brought up the need to cut the ivy choking our trees. Geoff asked her to set up a work party and we will make it happen. Marlies Van Cise noticed that our General meeting in November is the night before Thanksgiving. We will look into the possibility of changing it. "CC" Williams announced that KeyFest could use some LIC volunteers and to contact her if you can help. Tim Heitzman announced that the Croquet Tournament is the following weekend and will benefit the Vaughn Civic Center. Volunteers and players are welcome and should contact Tim. The Two Waters Arts Alliance's "Spring Fling" is March 10th at the Vaughn Civic Center and we are encouraged to support them by attending.

Nancy Carr announced that she is having a hard time sending out the LIC Newsletter as email providers are making it difficult to send out such large files to so many recipients. She would like to try posting the newsletter to the LIC website instead at www.longbranchimprovementclub.org. It will be posted both in color and in a black and white


