# **President's Message**

<u>Septic System</u>: The new septic system for the clubhouse has been installed, inspected and approved for use. Thanks to all who assisted in getting this project done in a timely manner. It was a bit inconvenient to rely on Honey Buckets instead of indoor toilets during the replacement project, especially for some of our building renters, but we had no choice. Now we have a modern system that can handle large crowds which we are seeing for more and more of our events.

The Centennial Plan: Your Board will be tackling the issue of Long Range Planning once again, beginning with its October meeting. About two years ago, Geoff Baillie put forth the idea that the LIC needs to take a close look at its mission and how it operates, so that it can not only serve its members and fulfill its role in the community, but weather the changing financial and regulatory landscape. In other words, so that the LIC can actually continue to exist. The replacement of our wharf at the marina, our failed heating and septic systems, the costs of maintaining a deteriorating clubhouse, etc. are all examples of challenges that we have faced just within these last few years. These projects all come with big price tags, and looming on the horizon are things such as improvements to the marina in order to meet DNR lease renewal requirements, repairing or replacing our clubhouse roof, and who knows what else.

Unless we are sure of who we are and how we fit into our community, and unless we optimize our operations in fiscally sound ways, we may not be ready for these challenges. This is "Why" of Long Range Planning. The "How" is the next part of the process. There are several ways this can be approached, and the Board will be evaluating them in order to bring a recommendation to the membership as to how we might best proceed. We do already have a running start on the "What": you may recall the member surveys and discussions about how we might improve the LIC. We have this data and it will be important to include in discussions as we move forward.

The "Who" part of the process is YOU. As we get organized and begin to tackle various aspects of a comprehensive plan, it is going to require thoughtful input and participation by our members. Please volunteer if you are asked, or come forward on your own, to be involved in the planning process.

It so happens that the LIC has its 100th birthday coming up in 2021! This is yet another reason for getting serious about defining who we are and securing our future. Let's be sure that when our Centennial Celebration arrives we are still here, healthy and stronger than ever!

Board Members present: Gayle Brewer, Clark Van Bogart, FrancieCarr, Doug Lewis, Eloise Colbert and Phil Johnson Meeting called to order by President Gayle Brewer.

Our guest speaker this month was from Harbor Wildwatch. Lindsey Johnson the executive director, introduced Rachael Easton, the Program Director, who gave a slide show presentation of the "Big, Beautiful and Bizarre in Puget Sound". Rachael shared the extraordinary lifestyle adaptations of the sea life we all thought we knew so well. Her storytelling style had the membership riveted to the presentation. It was a lot of fun. Rachael and Lindsay ended their presentation by inviting the LIC membership to join in their upcoming activities.

<u>Rental Agent:</u> Kim Chaney reported the last month was busy at the LIC with rentals. And the clubhouse is booked for two weddings in Oct and Nov.

<u>Dockmaster</u>: Lynn Carr also reported another busy month at the marina with visiting yacht clubs calling ahead for Oct. and Nov.

Substituting for Secretary Peg Bingham, Judy Riggs asked to have the minutes of the last meeting approved. Motion made, seconded and approved.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Francie Carr began with a friendly reminder that it is possible to have a glass of wine or beer at the LIC meeting, however a \$4.00 "donation" is asked to cover the cost. She also wants the membership to know that all the cookbook fundraising will go into the kitchen fund for future needs. Other news includes Pierce County is accepting applications for environmental grants for water quality issues within watersheds education. Grants will be awarded to either groups or individuals.

Quarterly moorage is due Oct 1<sup>st</sup>. Also, the 2014 budget planning is currently accepting requests from the membership. These need to be submitted as soon as possible.

Building rental and Marina moorage remain above the annual budget.

The Drum Festival was a break even event and a great friend builder. The Key Pen Parks matching grant paper work has been submitted.

The Labor Day Dance did well and congratulations to Tim and the Events Committee.

The sale of the placemats has now exceeded the purchase price.

<u>Events:</u> The Labor Day Dance was a success bringing in 30-40 boating guests and 150 guests arriving in cars. Kurt reports that there were 3 successful LIC and friends boating outings this summer. This last boating trip took 5 boats and 21 passengers to lunch and a fascinating tour of the Narrows Brewery.

<u>Upcoming Events:</u> A favorite musical group, Brother Sun, is back for another Concert set for Oct. 19. And Trunk or Treat is again being hosted by LIC and organized by the Evergreen Elementary PTA. LIC members are invited to set up trick or treat stations from the trunk of their cars in the LIC parking lot and enjoy the costume party. Doug is looking for volunteers to help set up and decorate the haunted house in the LIC lobby.

Oct 5 Fiber Arts and Farm tour has Carolyn Wiley looking for volunteers. She has booked 28 artists and vendors. Still needed are demonstrators for knot tying. Also, crochet and knitting (perhaps an LIC table to share the task?). There will be a scarecrow competition from Key Center to Longbranch if anyone feels they would like to represent LIC and build one. Other volunteers are still needed for organizing, setting up and running the event. Please contact Carolyn to help. 884-9157

<u>Bldg and Grounds</u>: Doug reports that the new Septic System is up and running. It took 3 days to put in (3) 1,500 gallon pump out tanks and (3) 1,500 gallon septic tanks as well as a very long and narrow drain field.

There was some discussion about the upkeep and use of the historic baseball diamond where the new septic drain field now extends along the first base line. Large rocks were placed as a blockade for cars. Doug suggests a spring work party to refurbish the field may be planned. Also, membership should be aware that the LIC does not have a recycling program, so please don't bring your household recycling to the dumpster. It just creates more work for Doug. The LIC Nature Trail project is almost finished with 20' left to build. Larry Bingham is asking for lumber donations. He and Clark need at least 4' long in 2x8 or 2x10 or 2x12. Call if you can help.

<u>Membership:</u> Eloise reports that there is currently 109 memberships with one new member. Also, members should routinely check their totals for meetings and hours when signing in at the General Meeting. If there are any discrepancies to please let her know as soon as possible.

Marina: Clark and Denny will attend a hearing with WA State Oct. 24 to plea for a reduction in the required insurance rate for the LIC Marina.

There is a proposed change in the wording of the Marina By-Laws to better clarify the requirements of membership meeting attendances and volunteer hours for marina moorage and special clubhouse rental rates. The wording change will reflect the procedure we have used in the past of 3 meetings and 15 volunteer hours accumulated in the previous year rather than as an on-going previous 12 months accounting at any given time. The proposed change was presented to the membership and is considered the first reading. It will be presented again at the at the next general meeting and be voted upon. The marina committee has developed a standard procedure for handling overdue moorage bills. There have been 3 resolved occurrences, with one still outstanding for this year. An abandoned 28' Newport sailboat is being prepared for auction. Anyone interested can see this boat at the end of B Dock.

<u>Sunshine Lady:</u> Marlise Van Cise is happy to report that Norma Larson had a successful hip replacement surgery. And Buck (William Buckner) has gotten married.

Congratulations! Wally Johnson brought Dave Dahl to the meeting. He looks good and it is good to see him too!

On Thursday, September 12, 21 participants came out for the LIC Boaters Group outing to the Boathouse 19 restaurant, which is located at the Narrows Marina, just south of the Tacoma Narrows Bridge. Although there was an overcast down to the treetops in all directions, and a marginal fog-restricted visibility east of Balch Passage, our destination was to the north, where things were looking a little better. A pre-departure observation near Mahncke Point revealed that we had good visibility well north of Fox Island, and a last minute check of the DOT camera on the Tacoma Narrows Bridge revealed that we were good to go. So, away we went, out of Filucy Bay, north through Pitt Passage, west of Wycoff Schoal, north across Carr Inlet, with a turn to the east at the west end of Hale Passage. From there, after passing under the Fox Island Bridge, it was pretty much a straight easterly shot through Hale Passage to our destination. This time, when the captain of the lead boat encountered some reduced visibility, he held to a straight line course between points A and B, and although this novel approach was a little disconcerting for those who followed, it did prove to be the shortest distance.

Once there, all five boats moored at the Marina's new guest moorage dock, which due to a strong current, proved to be a bit of a challenge for some of the captains (video available for a small fee). We then headed for the restaurant, which was being guarded by members of our advanced scouting team (Lynn & Nancy Carr, and Harry & MR Faas) who had driven their cars around. Once again, we had some truly outstanding meals, accompanied by the usual laughter and frivolity. - This really is a fun group. Check out the accompanying photos!

This time for our post-meal activity, Joe Walts, brewmaster of the two month-old Narrows Brewery (which is located right next door) took us on a tour of their brewing facilities.
