Meeting called to order at 7:24 p.m.

Agenda was presented. Sunshine Lady's report was moved to #3. Agenda approved as changed.

No speaker tonight.

REPORTS

SUNSHINE LADY, VICKIE BIGGS: Vickie reported that flower bouquets were sent to Marlies Van Cise, Theresa Gano and Lindsey Babich. Vickie also reminded the members that if anyone knows of any members who needs flowers, cards or just phone calls, let her know. Best way to contact her is e-mail.

RENTAL AGENT, SHARON GEARHART: No report. Sharon not present.

DOCK MASTER, LYNN CARR: Lynn reported it had been an interesting week. We do not usually have visiting boats on Monday or Tuesday. Monday we had four, Tuesday we had eight. Lynn said we ended up with forty four boats from Sunday to Sunday. It was a ghost town today. Health Department inspected the marina a couple weeks ago. Lynn e-mailed the report to the Board, if anyone is interested in reading it he has copies available. Lynn has the Navy Bremerton Yacht Club coming in this coming weekend. He is looking for help to do some work at the marina when the weather is better. Lynn was asked if the Health Department was happy and he said yes. Craig McDaniels, who worked on boats at the marina last year, was killed in an accident in California. Lynn is working on getting his derelict boat removed from the bay. He took family members out to the boat to remove personal effects. Hopefully the boat will be gone by the end of next week.

Lynn thanked Geoff for lending him his boat to take Sara Van Geldrun from the County out to collect soil samples, etc. from the bay. Lynn Larson explained that the County has a grant to do an archeological survey of Filucy Bay. This is the third time they have taken archeologists out. So many landowners agreed to let them on their property that they had to go back to the County for more money to complete the survey. They found many new sites on the bay. They found nine in 1949, three around 1985 and again in 2000. They usually do not get a chance to examine private property so this was fantastic. .

BOARD MEMBER REPORTS:

SECRETARY, PEG BINGHAM: Peg asked to have the minutes of the last meeting approved. Motion to approve was made, seconded and approved.

Peg then read a thank you note from Theresa Gano.

TREASURER, FRANCIE CARR: Francie said copies of the Profit and Loss and Balance Sheet are on the tables. Expenses for the building and marina are below budget. Rental income from the building and the marina is also slightly below budget. Capital budget shows that improvements for the building are below budget, but that is because we paid for the new stove in 2011, but that helped us pay for the new electrical vault that we had to install which was unexpected and not budgeted. There is no capital expenditure for the marina but we did pay \$3138 for new wiring at the dock. Third quarter moorage is due the end of July for those paying quarterly.

MEMBERSHIP, CC WILLIAMS: CC said thank you to tonight's kitchen crew, Lynn Lloyd and Jan Prichard. Currently there are 162 members and 141 memberships. The drawing tonight made \$52 for the scholarship fund. Winners of tonight's drawing were Connie Hildahl and Mike Runyon.

The Labor Day Dance with Mojo Overload is on the calendar for September 1st and volunteers are needed. We are also planning a really great fall full of events including the Halloween Dance (get your costumes ready). Kurt Anderson made an announcement about the power boat trip over to Steilacoom for breakfast on Tuesday, July 24th from 4 - 6. Once out of the bay it is about a twenty minute trip. Let him know if you are planning to join the group. Tim reminded everyone about the wine tasting at the marina this coming Saturday, July 21st. The Blend Wine Shop brings a collection of red and white wines. For six dollars you can taste four wines or have one large glass of one wine.

What's happening to the LIC Forest?

Lately you may have noticed a lot of the green leaves in the LIC forest are slowly turning brown, epically just north of the clubhouse. If viewed from the road as you quickly drive by, it can easily look like many of our trees are dying. But, in fact, just the opposite is taking place, for much of our forest is getting a new lease on life. Over the years ivy vines have grown up the trunks of most of the trees in our forest. The ivy on many of the trees adjacent to the walking trail has been trimmed back over the years, but the ivy on the vast majority of the trees away from the trail has never been trimmed. A number of trees have died because of the effect of the ivy, and others have blown over in windstorms due to the added weight and wind resistance.

Starting three months ago, the Longbranch Improvement Club Ivy Eradication Squad (LICIES) started cutting the ivy vines on the trees that are located away from the walking trail. To date 66 trees have been released from the death grip of the ivy. Some of the larger trees had more than 100 separate vines growing up their trunks. Most of the vines were small to medium in size, but some were larger around than the average person's upper leg. According to the LICIES, there are about 200 trees and a year's worth of cutting and sawing left to go. Eventually our forest will again turn green, and many trees that would have otherwise died will be saved. In the meantime, expect to see a wave of dying ivy leaves progressing across our forest. – If you would like to take an active part in helping the LICIES to attack the ivy, contact Kurt Anderson at 253 350-0309 or hound356@gmail.com. – Also, look for a display of some of the larger vines at one of our upcoming general meetings.

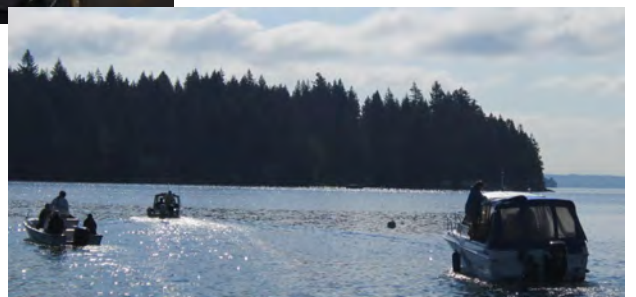

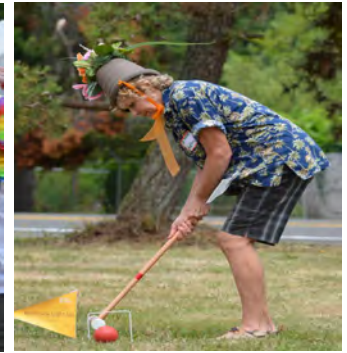


