Leaves are changing, the drought is largely gone with some abundant rainfall lately, and we're beginning the month with the Farm Tour. It's definitely autumn on the Key Peninsula.

The LIC has been taking abundant precautions with the Farm Tour, in particular, and with our hybrid meetings to keep people safe when they're together. Vaccination rates for both the north and south KP remain stubbornly low but are slowly climbing. Work, meanwhile, continues on getting funding and planning is ongoing on how to replace the clubhouse roof, provide a sprinkler system, insulation, and other improvements that over the long run will lower our overall upkeep and insurance costs. And it's exciting to see those plans as they develop.


