LONGBRANCH IMPROVEMENT CLUB GENERAL MEETING MINUTES JULY 15, 2015

The LIC Membership Meeting on 07/15/15 in the LIC lobby was called to order at 7:00PM.

Guest Speaker, Tarin Todd, from Citizens for a Healthy Bay, gave a slide show presentation on the Derelict Vessel Prevention Program. Thanks to Helen and Kerry Jamieson for contacting the speaker for this meeting.

CONTRACTOR REPORTS

LIC Dockmaster: Lynn Carr reports that the Marina was very busy this month. Among the visiting boaters were members from the Fircrest Yacht Club, and the Queen City Yacht Club. Also, the West Pierce County Fire District fire boat, moored at Pt. Defiance, made a trial run to the Longbranch Marina and found, that it would take them approx. 15 minutes to get here. Lynn says that if needed, they would coordinate with the fire boat on Anderson Island for emergencies.

LIC Rental Agent: Lori Deacon reports that the Board has set a new Clubhouse Policy. Due to excessive wear and tear on the building, winter fuel costs and cleaning costs, the LIC Clubhouse will be closed for rentals from November 10th to March 1st. Instead, just the annual club functions will continue to take place. Current reservations will be honored. Lori Deacon reports, that currently there are 17 paid bookings through 11/04/15.

BOARD and COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Secretary</u>: Judy Riggs asked, and it was MS, to accept the June 2015 LIC General Membership Meeting minutes as written.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Jim Hettinger reports, that building rental income is \$3000 over budget for the year. Total revenue for the first half is \$1300 over budget. Expenses are under budget year to date, but that will change when some professional fees come due over the next few months. Monies were transferred to the Designated Reserves funds to cover the sum of the net equity accounts.

Membership: Nancy Carr is updating the website and sorting out possible software issues. She has posted updated Marina information, the LIC Long Range Plan, and an updated contact list. Nancy is planning to coordinate her Membership Committee with the Events Committee in the future.

Thank you to our meeting hostesses Theresa Gano, Susan Quigley, and Carolyn Wiley.

<u>Events</u>: Delia McGinnis reports, that LIC volunteers have partnered with the KP Business Associates, and other volunteers to establish and maintain the beautiful flower boxes throughout the downtown Key Center area.

Delia reported, that the Food Bank donations from our General Meetings will be delivered alternately between both Lakebay Food Banks. Also, volunteers are planning to fix and beautify the historic Longbranch town sign located along the road between the clubhouse and marina.

<u>Building and Grounds:</u> Sharon Gearhart reports, that the LIC acquired a 2 year service contract for the propane heaters in the Clubhouse. It will begin on the date of the first annual maintenance service planned for this fall. The pot holes in the driveway are in the process of repair. The cement footing around the flag pole has been completed thanks to Tom Osborne. Lynn Carr has prepared a log for the front porch support beam replacement. Barb Floyd has been doing maintenance work on the Historic Building plaque mounted on the outside front of the clubhouse. Sharon is compiling a "to do" list for volunteers, including repair of the garbage area gate and weed whacking the area behind the building to the trails.

<u>Marina</u>: Mark Runions gave an update of dock maintenance and repair priorities. These include modifying the dingy dock to eliminate the sinking section; making room for new finger slips; adding "No Reservations" signage for visiting boaters to clarify the sharing of the LIC dock policy; replacement of failing pilings; rearranging the new permanent moorage space to better accommodate transient moorage; and recruiting more members to the LIC/DNR renewal lease committee.

In August, Jeff Hartjoy will present a program of an ocean sailing tour around the world. Old LIC members, Jeff and his wife Debbie, left the Longbranch Marina 15 years ago on a sailing adventure, which hasn't yet ended. They are visiting our area before continuing their world tour.

<u>Trustee at Large</u>: Gayle Brewer had nothing to report.

Vice President: Clark Van Bogart had nothing to report.

President: Francie Carr had nothing to report.

OLD and IN PROGRESS BUSINESS

Sharon announced, that the Committee completed and submitted the application for the Pierce County Historic Building Grant. The LIC Grant Committee asked for a \$12,640 matching grant. Sharon presented a bound copy of the grant, that was over an inch thick, suggesting the amount of work the committee accomplished to produce it.

Phil reports that the Marso property sale is completed thanks in large part to Larry Bingham's work on this project. Phil says to expect soon to see a 6' wood privacy fence on the LIC border between the ball field and the Marso storage building. The net proceeds from the \$5,000 Marso property sale will go into a budget category, called Matching Funds for the 2016 Pierce County Historic Building Grant, in case the LIC receives the grant.



"CAPE HORN- ONCE MORE AND BEYOND"

Former Longbranch residents, Jeff & Debbie Hartjoy, have quite a story to tell.

Since leaving Puget Sound in 1999 and 'turning left' at Cape Flattery, they have logged over 85,000 miles at sea aboard their Baba 40 sailboat, "Sailor's Run", and will be back in Longbranch on August 25th to share their adventures with old friends,

neighbors, and guests, at the Longbranch Improvement Club. Jeff will take listeners on a trip through the Southern oceans, including his solo transit from Ecuador to Argentina via Cape Horn. Jeff's presentation will include photos of sunny beaches, local islanders, and occasional gatherings of fellow cruisers at some of their favorite spots from Baja, Central and South America, and the South Seas. Of course, it's not all fair winds, coconuts and palm trees out there on the blue water, so he will also recount his passage around notorious Cape Horn, dealing with 50-knot winds, blown sails, gear failures, and electrical fire, and a punishing knockdown off the Falklands.

But wait! There's more! Jeff is now preparing for another solo rounding of Cape Horn. This time he will keep going east, as he attempts a nonstop circumnavigation via the Five Great Capes. His plan is to accomplish this feat in about 5 months, and he has vowed to not use his engine or accept outside assistance. He plans to leave Ecuador around Halloween, and with any luck, hopes to arrive back in Ecuador by his 70th birthday next April. This is not a 'bucket list' stunt, Jeff just plain loves sailing. He will share his enthusiasm, determination, and sense of humor with all, who attend this special presentation, whether you are an Armchair Adventurer or an experienced sailor.

The program will be on <u>August 25th</u>, Tuesday evening, starting at 7:30 pm at the Longbranch Improvement Club Hall, 4312 Key Peninsula Highway, Longbranch WA. 98351.
