



Please enter your volunteer hours in Track It Forward when completing your task. If you are having trouble with Track It Forward or have questions about entering your hours, do not hesitate to call or email me, I will be very happy to help.

We have discovered a 'feature' in our Track It Forward software. As you are probably aware, when you receive an email from the system with a notification of something coming up or a copy of the monthly newsletter, you have the option of 'unsubscribing'. This is very easy to do by clicking on the unsubscribe option. HOWEVER, this unsubscribes you from all future notifications, announcements,

and newsletters. To undo the 'unsubscribe', the member must log into the system and check the notification button to reactivate. This is something only you can do – the system admins cannot. If you are thinking of unsubscribing instead of just deleting unwanted information, let me know and maybe we can find another option for you.
