

General Meeting Minutes

Longbranch Improvement Club General Meeting October 21, 2009

The meeting was called to order by Pat Muchmore, president, following a potluck dinner.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Pat announced that we have a new rental agent Lynn Dalsing, who can be reached by calling the LIC and leaving a message. Four LIC Board positions are up for election: Vice President, Secretary, Building & Grounds Chair and Events Chair. Any suggestions can be given to the nominating committee: Geoffrey Baillie, Chair; Cindy Evans & Judy Riggs.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Larry Bingham, Vice President, conducted a discussion of the proposed By-Laws changes. The most debated proposal surrounded the possible extension of membership boundaries to include all of Key Peninsula, i.e. the same boundaries as those for the Key Peninsula Middle School. By extending the boundaries, the by-laws committee is looking to draw in new members and give people who would formerly only be associate members the power to vote and, therefore, more of an incentive to become involved members. Objections to the boundaries being extended came from many members. It was suggested that we have not tapped the potential memberships in the existing area and work could be done to focus on member recruitment. Some felt that keeping the LIC for the Longbranch end of the Peninsula was important. Another issue was the possibility of a much longer waiting list for the marina. Suggestions were made that we might keep the same boundaries, or less extensively expanded boundaries, and give associate members voting rights, but not allow moorage privileges.

The only other significant proposed change to the by-laws was changing the term of office to two years and having annual elections for half the board in alternating years. The committee proposed this change as elections every 6 months have proved cumbersome and officers barely get used to their positions before another election rolls around. It was brought up that 2 years might be too long a commitment to attract nominees while some felt the change was an improvement.

Other proposed by-laws changes are clarifications more than actual changes such as the fact two adult members may vote from each family membership.

There will be another meeting scheduled to discuss everyone's by-laws concerns before the November general meeting. The date is to be determined and published in the newsletter. A hard copy of the current proposal can be sent on request and the proposed by-laws will be posted on the web. The November meeting will also discuss the by-laws and if there is consensus they will be voted on.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: A motion was made and seconded that the minutes be approved as published in the October newsletter.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Tim Heitzman, treasurer, reported that our 2009 Profit and Loss statement shows a positive balance. We have an expense coming up to replace the outdated fire prevention system on the stove that will cost \$2000 to \$3000 dollars.

Tim encouraged everyone to take part in the three, two-hour meetings to

take place in January, February and March 2010. These will be brain-storming sessions to plan for long term goals in the following four areas: Marina, Clubhouse, Community, Events and Dances. As encouragement to attend, it was suggested that hours would be earned for time spent at these meetings. It was suggested that members who do/don't own boats should all be encouraged to participate in the planning for the marina as its future matters to all of us. Sign up sheets were passed around.

DOCK CHAIR REPORT: Dave Wickland, dock chair, had copies of an article from the "Nor'westing" magazine citing the Longbranch Marina as the "Marina of the Month". A seven-member work party did a lot of electrical, bird proofing and other work at the dock this month and much more work is needed. It was emphasized the dock is deteriorating faster than we can do the work and more help and eventual dollars are needed. A big expense will be fixing the water system to the dock. The well in use now is too shallow and water pressure is a concern. The dock committee is looking at many alternatives.

Winter moorage applications for Nov. 1 through March 31st are being accepted. Contact Dave, Harry Faas, or Mark Jones, dock master. Liability insurance is required and will be required from permanent moorage tenants when they renew in January. Gretchen Lippert suggested that taking the Boat U.S. free course and getting a boater education card could significantly reduce your insurance rates. A boater's card is now required for most boaters and costs \$10.00. It was asked why winter moorage needed to be paid in a lump sum, and less paperwork and oversight was the answer.

Mark Runions asked how many dock coupons were used and suggested we do that again. The status of the "Donna Lee" was brought up and Robin Gould said that a solution should be forthcoming by the end of the year.

BUILDING & GROUNDS CHAIR REPORT: Lynn Carr, building and grounds chair, asked for volunteers to take over the recycling of aluminum. Someone is needed to take over picking the cans up at the dock, storing them and taking the cans to Fife for recycling and payment. The money goes to the scholarship fund. The fencing of the garbage area has been done. The men's toilet is leaking and a volunteer is needed to fix it. All the fire extinguishers at the LIC and the dock have been serviced.

MEMBERSHIP CHAIR REPORT: Jan Prichard, membership chair, thanked Karen Johnson, Norma Larson, Denny Prichard and Trish Goodvin for helping out with serving, greeting and cleaning up.

EVENTS CHAIR REPORT: Carolyn Wiley, events chair, was absent but had sign-up sheets for helping with the Kuteeya Dancers event on November 14th, and the many activities in December: gilding the hydrangeas for the Christmas tree, getting the tree, decorating the LIC, feeding the decorating elves, gift wrapping Toys for Tots donations, helping at the Kids and Christmas event, helping with the Christmas dinner meeting, enjoying New Year's Eve, and de-decorating on January 2nd. Many hands are needed!

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Member Michael Hays is running for Key Peninsula Metro Park District. Member Richard Hanna is running for Fire District No. 16 Fire Commissioner. There is a Senior Housing Forum at the Library Thurs. Oct. 22nd from 4-6.

After several months of soliciting member input regarding By-Laws changes, the proposed revisions to the LIC By-Laws were ready for review. The draft document was presented at a meeting open to all members, on Tuesday, October 13, 2009.

At the October 21st General Meeting, copies of the proposed by-laws were distributed for the "first" reading of the document before the membership. The member's present voiced concerns regarding the proposed enlargement of the Regular Member boundaries.

In response to this a By-Laws General Meeting has been scheduled at the LIC on Thursday Nov 12th at 7PM to resolve the issue.
