I believe that the water is now working fine. This is a long term issue that we are working on with the other parties involved with the system and we should have some options to decide on in the coming months.

Please come down and get some of those hours in before the end of the year. If you can do electrical work, we need your help at the dock. We have outlet covers and new outlets to install. If we have a nice day, there is still some painting that we didn't finish up this year and if it's raining, then we can pressure wash some of the green off of the dock.


A great time was had by all and we were treated to some wonderful crab enchiladas after the race by Cindy Black, Yum! Thanks Cindy!


RECYCLING
