## **President's Message**

<u>The Dock Breakfast</u> was a real treat this year, thanks to a lot of hard work by the volunteers who made it happen, and assisted by one of the more glorious weather days of the year so far. Over 180 breakfasts were served and we had lots of visitors. Special thanks to Doug Sylvers who organized the event again this year.

The dedication ceremony for the Geoff Baillie Wharf was both poignant and inspiring. Terry Lee, former Pierce County Councilman, shared memories of working with Geoff to cut through the red tape and get the project approved in record time. LIC members Lynn Carr, Kurt Anderson and Lisa Bryan shared personal memories and Lynn Larson shared memories of being on the dock with Geoff. The memorial plaque was unveiled; it is now installed on the wharf walkway. Next time you visit the Marina, be sure to take a look at it. Thanks are due to Tim Heitzman and Clark VanBogart who designed and executed the plaque, and to the LIC members who donated the funds to purchase it.

Another LIC home run was the Memorial Day Dance. Over 225 were in attendance to dance to live music by Fingertips, socialize, and share a libation. The building was truly rocking with happy people! The Marina was jammed with boats and Dockmaster Lynn Carr sold 100 dance tickets to boaters in advance of the event. The financial details are yet to settle out as I write this two days post-event, but I'm pretty sure we made a nice profit as well as lots of new friends. Tim Heitzman and his Events Committee just keep rolling out excellent affairs for us to enjoy. Of course organizing an event is one thing, but having it "happen" requires a lot of volunteer effort, which is where the entire LIC membership enters the picture. There are too many persons to thank individually, but it would be an oversight not to mention Peg Bingham and Sharon Gearhart and the rest of the tireless kitchen crew!

The Marina Committee is continuing to prepare for the DNR lease renewal in 2017. Kurt Anderson and Denny Prichard met at the Marina on May 23rd with representatives of the DNR to look over the Marina in a preliminary way as they begin the process of determining what modifications will be required prior to lease renewal (and going forward beyond 2017). We hope to see a report based on this visit from DNR in a few months, at which time we will begin to have a clearer idea of what we are facing. Stay tuned.

At the June meeting, there will be elections of the position of President, Treasurer, Membership Chair and Marina Chair. As of this writing, Nominating Committee Chair Pat Muchmore is still seeking nominees for Treasurer and Membership. Please step forward and get involved! Nominations will also be accepted from the floor prior to voting. Also at the June meeting, students who were chosen to receive LIC scholarship aid will be our guests and introduced to the membership.

#### LONGBRANCH IMPROVEMENT CLUB GENERAL MEETING MINUTES May 15, 2013

PROGRAM SPEAKER: Author Dick Blumenthal gave an interesting talk on the derivation of names of Inland Washington waters including Filucy Bay. This was followed by a question and answer period.

#### CONTRACTOR REPORTS:

Dock Master: Lynn Carr reported that he has locked the dumpsters at the dock to keep persons other than marina boaters from dumping trash in them. There are two garbage cans down on the dock that can be used by boaters.

Rental Agent: Kim Chaney reported a slow May but June and July are busy. There have been a number of inquires about using the building so she is anticipating more rentals. We have been added to the Gig Harbor Guide website.

#### **BOARD REPORTS:**

Secretary: Peg Bingham asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the last meeting. Motion made, seconded and passed.

Treasurer: Francie Carr not present. Gayle read her report. Copies of the Profit and Loss Sheet were available on each table. Francie reported that through the end of April almost \$1500 has been received for the Geoff Baillie Memorial Fund. The "Blame Sally" concert brought in \$2,434 in revenue with \$1,948 in expenses for a net income of \$486. The Dock Breakfast generated \$1,226 in donations, \$213 in raffle ticket sales and \$79 for aprons. Three new memberships were received. Doug Sylvers was reimbursed \$304 for the breakfast expenses. Revenue for the marina is \$15,000 more than expected for this period.

Overall, revenue is \$29,000 above expectations for this period.

Building expenses are \$3,400 below expenditures. Events are above the expected year to date expenses, but included are \$777.64 for the new placements and expenses for the pancake breakfast and the "Blame Sally" concert. Marina expenses are below the expected year to date level.

The Geoff Baillie marina plaque invoice in the amount of \$1,250 has been paid. There will be money left to send to Evergreen School for the Geoff Baillie fund there. With income up and expenses below expected amounts, the LIC has a net profit of \$29,253 through April. The checking account balance is \$67,410.63.

Events: Tim Heitzman said there are 151 people following our Facebook page. There are three events coming up and volunteers are needed. Tim passed around clipboards to sign up to help. Memorial Day Dance is coming up this month. It is our biggest moneymaker and volunteers are needed. July 21st we have the Croquet Tournament. This event is a fun day. You could sign on to help or you could also form a team of four players and participate in the tournament itself or just come and cheer on your favorite team. August 10th we have a new event, the Drum Festival. This is a free event all day and there will be our grill set up outside with grilled onions and brats and a beer garden. This is going to be a great family friendly fun event and it will be because you volunteered to make it a success. If you volunteer you are not required to work the entire day but a couple or more hours of your time is greatly appreciated

Building and Grounds: Doug Lewis not present – no report.

Membership: Jan Prichard thanked Kathy Bailey and Dee and Dick Scharf for acting as host and hostesses. She also thanked Trish Goodvin and Connie Copeland for signing members in and selling raffle tickets. Jan reported we have 104 memberships equaling about 177 members.

Marina: Harry Faas had no report but thanked Jan and Denny Prichard for the hanging baskets and pots full of colorful flowers brightening up the marina.

Trustee At Large: Phil Johnson had no report tonight.

Sunshine Lady: Vickie Biggs had no report tonight.

Newsletter: Nancy Carr asked that photos and articles for the next newsletter be sent to her by May 27<sup>th</sup>.

Vice President: Clark Van Bogart had no report tonight.

President: Gayle Brewer thanked Denny Prichard for setting up a sprinkler system for the flower containers at the marina and Jan Prichard and Shirley Brewer for planting the flower beds at the clubhouse.

Old Business: Gayle asked Harry if he would like to recap the Dock Breakfast. Harry recognized Doug Sylvers for his organizing and managing skills in chairing the Dock Breakfast. Harry did not have official numbers but understands 182 breakfasts were sold. While that is not a record it is more than last year. He thanked Dave and Paula Wickland for their donation of the boat model for the raffle and Nancy Carr for her donation of beautiful aprons. He also recognized Donna and Dave Delk for the fresh flower bouquets on all the tables. Everyone thought the tribute to Geoff was very thoughtful and well done. Sandy Black expressed his appreciation of all the work done by Pat Thompson in organizing the sailboat race.

Gayle reported the plaque was now installed on the wharf. Clark Van Bogart, Gayle and Lynn Carr handled the installation. Clark reported that the Geoff Baillie plaque for the clubhouse will be placed with the Vernon Merrill plaque on the meeting room wall in time for the June membership meeting. Clark is making a mounting for the Merrill plaque similar to the one on the Baillie plaque.

As of May 15 the memorial fund set up for Geoff Baillie is closed for accounting purposes. We exceeded the amount required to pay for the plaques and the balance will be sent to Evergreen School. If anyone is still interested in contributing in Geoff's memory please send the money directly to Evergreen.

Barb Van Bogart gave an update on the cookbook project. We have received 380 recipes. Our target was 300 – 350. We will not accept any more recipes after tonight. The editing, proofing and testing phase will now begin with a target date of Aug. first for submission to the publishing company. Our goal is to have the cookbook ready for sale at the Fiber Arts Show, Oct. 5<sup>th</sup>. Price of cookbook will be \$20 and it will be a first class job.

Gayle reported that at their last meeting, the Board approved the policy for enforcement of moorage regulations. For a number of years we have had policies and regulations for the marina but we did not have any way to enforce them. We finally had a real need to enforce them and Washington State does have laws that cover that need. Phil Johnson and Clark Van Bogart reviewed these laws for what would apply to the needs of the LIC and came up with a draft of a policy. After working on it the marina committee presented a final draft to the Board and it was approved. Now the LIC has a procedure for enforcing our bylaws and dock regulations.

The new placemats are for sale for \$14.95 a set of four. There are four different pictures in each. set. The member price is \$10 per set tonight. Dance tickets are for sale for \$15 each, but the member price tonight is two for \$25. Croquet Tournament team registration will be discounted \$10 if submitted by the end of May.

Pat Muchmore reported on a very successful road clean-up last Saturday. Ten people volunteered and the weather cooperated. Thirty bags of trash were collected. Depending on the road condition the next cleanup will be in six to eight weeks. A notice will be sent out with the date of the next one.

Pat Muchmore reported that Gayle Brewer has agreed to run for President and Denny Prichard for Marina Chair. At this time there are no candidates for Treasurer or Membership. Ideally we would like to see two people for each position. The nominations will be announced at the June meeting with the election following. Installation of the new officers is July.
