<u>Ferry Returning to Longbranch</u>. For the weekend of May 16-18, at least. We are planning a major fund-raiser to benefit the LIC and its Scholarship Fund. The inspiration for this event came from Connie and Rich Hildahl, who have been busy with organizational plans. The venue will be a small ferry which after retirement from service was enclosed and refurbished by a private investor (to the tune of a million bucks) and turned into a "party boat". It will be docked at the marina and organizers are planning a series of events aboard to span Friday evening through Sunday. This event is on a bigger scale than anything the LIC has yet attempted, and if successful will help us fund generous scholarships for community youth and allow us to partially restore some of our capital reserves which were drained down by last year's heater and septic replacements. #### LONGBRANCH IMPROVEMENT CLUB GENERAL MEETING MINUTES January 15, 2014

LIC General Meeting 01-15-14 @ LIC lobby started with a very interesting film about Thea Foss. Afterwards, Bryn Foss Riddel was on hand to answer questions and told some funny stories about making this film. She and her son both had parts in the movie. Both have a tug boat named after them.

This was followed with an informative presentation by Citizens Against Crime. And an invitation to attend their next meeting.

President: Gayle Brewer called the general meeting to order.

<u>Dockmaster:</u> Reported that it was a slow month for visiting boaters. However, there are new fire extinguishers in the LIC boathouses and the Docks have been painted with designated labels "ABC & D. The Marina parking light was upgraded to meet current code and moved to a better location. The reader card to open the gate is not working but will be up and running soon.

Rental Agent : Kim was absent for a report.

<u>Secretary:</u> Judy is substituting for Peg Bingham who has resigned the LIC Board position of Sec. Judy Riggs was appointed to serve out her term ending in June. It was MSP to accept the minutes from the Dec LIC General Mtg.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Francie's summary of the 2013 LIC Budget ended with a net greater than what was expected. The 28' Newport sailboat has been sold for enough money to almost cover the past due moorage and fees. The LIC 2014 Marina moorage invoices were mailed out Dec 27, 2013. The payments on the LIC Wharf Promissory note and Bank Note were made as scheduled. Evergreen Elementary School PTA donated \$150 to LIC in appreciation for hosting the 2013 Halloween party for the kids. The LIC also received a \$100 donation from Jeff and Barb Boettcher. The net money from the LIC cookbook and the LIC cookbook artwork have been moved into a designated fund set up for the LIC Kitchen. The LIC building rentals for 2013 exceeded the expected number. Guest and member moorage was as expected by the budget. The LIC events were on target, but expenses were higher than expected due to the concerts and the Drum festival. The building expenses were less than expected. The bank charges were greater than expected due to the new credit card reader being used at the dock. Overall a profitable year at the LIC. Francie reminds us that LIC memberships are due. Also, she asks that the membership save their Peninsula Market receipts and bring them to the Club for a 1 percent refund.

<u>Events:</u> Tim reports that there will be a Pancake Breakfast Sat Feb 8 at 9:00 to 12:00. Connie and Rich Hildahl and volunteers are making plans for a scholarship fund raiser to take place in May. More to come on that later.

<u>Membership</u>: Elosie reports that there are currently 33 paid memberships and 11 lifetime memberships. New memberships paid in Nov/Dec will be rolled over to 2014 credit. Guests were introduced and the hosts for the dessert meeting were thanked: Connie Wick, Ann Dearing and Theresa Gano.

<u>Bldg and Grounds</u>: Doug asks that anyone who notices needed repairs around the building or grounds to please bring it to his attention. A work party will soon be organized for spring. He also reminded us that the cleaner we leave the building after a club event, the more money we save in cleaning expenses. It also allows a quick turn around for the next building rental. We had another issue with the septic system and got it resolved. Signs will be posted in the bathrooms to help renters to use our system with care.

#### We just have one Life, Keep it Simple

At 96 and 94 we continually adjust to the aging processes. Our naps are long, delicious, and continue to refresh. Addie cannot take care of herself and so is now confined to bed much of the time. She now sleeps in the dining room in a hospital bed under 24 hour supervision of caregivers. For a time she was under care of Hospice, but improved enough for them to stop seeing her. Remarkably, she never complains about her blindness, although she is impatient at not seeing food on her plate or at not recognizing the faces of friends.

There is no good time to give up a driver's license, but in a rush of patriotism at the behest of the family I gave up mine with two years to go on the license and sold the car as a safeguard. I felt I couldn't complain about bad older drivers, while slowly becoming one myself. I hate putting an extra load on the family. Fortunately, they provide help in many ways with grace and good humor.

The scene on the front of this card is very special to me. For nearly twenty years it was a common everyday view that could draw forth deep emotions. Our retirement home was around the corner. and down the bay. We're now in post-retirement in benign Oceanside where we spend a lot of time reminiscing about our good old days, and what lovely days they were.

The scene is looking east from the Longbranch Marina across Filucy Bay to Mt. Rainier. We early on learned that Filucy bay in a small boat at sunset could bring magic into our lives. The breezes of the afternoon and early evening tend to calm by sunset. The surface becomes glossy smooth and highly reflective, of the blue sky, pink, or golden clouds, black forest, on a background of gray, green water. We were part of a huge ever changing art piece.

Then as the sun dips below the distant Olympics to the west, Mt. Rainier blushes a rosy pink, and as the last rays of the sun leave "The Mountain", it stands, cold, foreboding a deadly gray-white and I am swept with a feeling of sweet sadness that another day has died. At these times, our granddaughters as little girls talked in hushed tones suggesting that they were experiencing kindred emotions. And best of all, Addie too still remembers.
