President's Message

<u>Marina Assessment.</u> At the July membership meeting, the need for a professional, objective engineering assessment of our Marina was discussed, and the membership approved selection of Echelon Engineering to perform the assessment. They will soon be starting work on the project. As discussed at the meeting, this information is critical to formulate our plan to secure a renewal of our lease with the DNR, which expires in 2017.

<u>Flagpole Installed</u>. We now have our new aluminum flagpole installed, to replace the old wooden one which broke during a winter storm. Next step is securing a flag of the correct size relative to the pole's height, and getting proper waterproof lighting installed. Thanks to Doug Lewis, Denny Prichard and Sharon Gearhart for working on this project.

"Geomythology" is the subject of the program at our September general membership meeting. This will be a return visit by Dr. Jeff Tepper of the University of Puget Sound Geology Department. You may remember the excellent program he presented on "Northwest Volcanoes and Earthquakes". This program deals with the question of what evidence exists in the geologic record to corroborate historical lore such as The Great Flood, The Lost Continent of Atlantis, etc. Invite your friends; this should be a very interesting program.

What a Summer! We live in an incredibly beautiful spot here in Puget Sound, and it seems even more special than usual when we have strings of sunny days like we have had this summer. <u>LIC Rental Agent</u>: Kim Chaney reports that Bldg rentals have been busy this month. There are bookings available for the end of summer if members or their friends are looking for a place for their event. The LIC is now being advertised free of charge as a venue on the Gig Harbor Event Resources website.

Secretary: (Judy Riggs) It was MSP to accept the LIC July General meeting minutes.

<u>Treasurer</u>: (Jim Hettinger) With visiting boaters, a concert, and building rentals, the LIC had good net income this month.

<u>Membership</u>: (Judy Riggs for Eloise Colbert) reports two new memberships this last month plus 4 new memberships at this evening meeting which makes 186 in total. A special thank you to our hostesses Linda LeBlanc, Ann Dearing and Jan Prichard.

<u>Events:</u> (Delia McGinnis) As busy as the weekend was with other events, Bebop Co-op had a good turnout of 60 people. The concert brought in \$817 for the LIC. Delia reports that Bebop Co-op is planning to come back to play at the LIC early next year. Preparations for the Labor Day Dance are going well with all volunteer positions filled. Coming up next is the Fiber Arts Festival / Farm Tour on Sat. Oct 4. Our own Shirley Brewer will be the featured artist, showcasing her beautiful quilts. Carolyn Wiley (884-9157) is looking for volunteers to help with the preparations and day of the event.

<u>Building and Grounds</u>: (Sharon Gearhart) reports that thanks are due to a group of member volunteers who have each adopted a portion of the grounds and /or gardens around the clubhouse to maintain, and now the grounds of the LIC are looking good. 

From our past.....

In Longbranch, as in much of rural America in the 1920's, baseball was a popular social event, bridging religious and language differences of immigrant settlers, and a welcome diversion from endless labor. Each community fielded a team—the Longbranch team quickly became the pride of the Peninsula. The LIC built a baseball field and grandstand on their cleared acreage.(LIC website)
