



The Longbranch Improvement Club (the "LIC") Nuts 'n' Bolts

This sheet sets out a few facts and tidbits of information you'll want to know about the LIC and The Longbranch Foundation ("TLF"). The LIC marks its 100th year of legal existence in 2021 – for more detailed information beyond what's set out here, visit www.licweb.org. The Longbranch Foundation (TLF) was formed in 2016 and is the 501(c)3 charitable organization affiliated with the LIC. For more information, visit www.longbranchfoundation.org

The clubhouse building (on the U. S. and Pierce County registers of historic places) and property, located at 4312 Key Peninsula Highway SW (across from the Longbranch Fire Station), is owned, managed and maintained by the LIC. It has had a number of upgrades over the past several years with grant assistance from The Longbranch Foundation and Pierce County.

The Longbranch Marina, located at 5213 Key Peninsula Highway SW, is also owned, managed and maintained by the LIC. In 2019, it received a major environmental and public safety upgrades with grant assistance from The Longbranch Foundation and the State of Washington.

General membership meetings: Held at the LIC clubhouse on the third Wednesday of each month. In odd numbered months, the dessert /appetizer potluck meetings start at 6:30 pm. In even numbered months, dinner potluck meetings start at 6:30 pm. LIC meetings are open to the public, and you're encouraged to invite neighbors, especially for interesting programs, usually in odd months.

Board of trustee meetings: Held monthly at the LIC clubhouse on the second Wednesday of each month at 7 pm.

Longbranch Marina provides permanent and temporary moorage for LIC Members plus guest moorage for visiting boaters from around Puget Sound and beyond It is an important and popular asset to the boating community and our community as it is open to the public. Privileges of membership: Members in good standing receive substantial discounts on permanent and temporary moorage and rental of the building and grounds, with complimentary use of the building for member's memorial services. Meeting attendance: In order to maintain "membership in good standing," you'll need to attend at least three meetings a year. Be sure to sign in at the meetings so we can track your participation. The meeting sign-in sheet shows recorded hours and meetings to date, making it easy to see where you are.

HOW TO VOLUNTEER (It's really easy)

Volunteer service: The LIC and TLF are non-profit volunteer-run organizations. Everything we do depends on volunteers. In addition to a requirement to attend at least three membership meetings annually, "Membership in good standing" status requires fifteen hours of volunteer time each year, and you will be presented with many opportunities to help.

If you noted a special area of interest, ability or expertise on your membership application, you may be contacted by a chairperson for a task, project or event. Volunteering gives more than a feeling of satisfaction, it's a great way to meet other members and know that you are helping improve your community.

There are many ways to earn your good standing status by volunteering service time. Be sure to log in and out at the event and double-check your accumulated balance when you sign in at regular monthly meetings.
