



LONGBRANCH IMPROVEMENT CLUB GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES July 20, 2011

Gayle Brewer announced that there are two programs coming up that will be presented on non-meeting nights. On Thursday, August 25th, the Center for Wooden Boats will be making a one hour presentation at the LIC. A date is still to be set for a presentation by Dr. Jeff Tepper, the chairman of the Geology Department of the University of Puget Sound. He will be talking about Earthquakes and Volcanoes of the Pacific Northwest and will probably be speaking to us sometime in September.

MEMBERSHIP

CC Williams, our membership chair, thanked our host and hostesses for the evening, Pat and Ruth Thompson and Dee Scharf.

TREASURER

Francie Carr, treasurer, handed out the balance sheet and profit and loss budget performance for the LIC as of June 30, 2011. Our savings are \$47,000. We continue to pay \$2,500 each month on our wharf bank loan, and the loan balance stands at \$92,600. The third quarter moorage payments are due July 31st. Francie also asked for all bills for the Croquet Tournament to be turned in as soon as possible.

Geoff announced that the moorage entrance was finished today and he thanked Bruce Jeglum and his team of designers and builders.

BUILDING AND GROUNDS

Sharon Gearhart, Building and Grounds Chair, thanked Mike Runyon for donating the large rocks that are now lining the parking area of the LIC grounds, and thanked Lynn Carr for helping to get them in place. We have a new light in the kitchen and a new cover for the thermostat. The grounds are looking great and she thanked all the folks who have been working on the lawns and gardens. She reminded us that to be "members in good standing" we need to give 15 hours on volunteer service to the LIC and she has jobs for anyone who may wish to get in some volunteer hours, cleaning and painting the office being just one example. The building is rented every weekend in August.

MARINA COMMITTEE

Denny Prichard gave the marina report in Randy Babich's absence. A new freezer is on the dock ready to be plugged in if the members give the okay. The new security system is in and working. It records on motion detection at the parking lot and the dock. Lynn Carr is a new member of the dock committee and has agreed to be in charge of the maintenance. There is much to be done and Lynn has a sign up sheet for willing volunteers. Denny thanked Tom Lupo for getting his insurance up to date and there is just one more boat that is still working to comply with our insurance requirements. The marina is now full.

Geoff mentioned that we are working with the heirs to Don Jopp's boat to help them stay at the dock while they are in the process of trying to find a buyer and with the members permission, we will continue to work with them.

EVENTS

Sandy Black, Events Chair, thanked everyone who has helped out with recent events and who have volunteered for Beyond the Borders. He especially thanked new members Bert and Christie Sawyers, Bill Buckner, and Larry and Laurie Anderson for working all day at Key Fest and also at the Croquet Tournament. He read a letter from Edie Morgan thanking the LIC for the money received from the Regatta held in May. Lynn Larson then read a thank you letter from Community in Schools for all the work that was done and all the fun that was had at the Croquet Tournament.

Sandy asked for more volunteers for Beyond the Borders and encouraged everyone to attend this great event. He especially asked for help with early set up on Saturday, August 6th at 9 a.m. Help can also be used Friday afternoon around 3 or 4 p.m. He added another "Thank You" to all the members who are so faithful and always help out. "You know who you are!".

Peg Bingham asked for anyone who has a food handler's card and can help baking before and/or serving at Beyond the Borders to please contact her. We need enough volunteers so that there can be shifts so no one has to work the entire time. She has enough cashiers.

Sharon Gearhart complimented the Croquet Tournament organizers for a very well run and fun event. Much applause and agreement ensued.

VICE PRESIDENT

Kurt Anderson, Vice-President, said we still have some LIC cups for sale. We're getting down on our logo wear, but will order more when needed. Nancy Carr is still taking order for fleeces and there are many options available. Getting our name on clothing is working for us. It does get noticed and people do comment on it.

PRESIDENT

Geoff Baillie, president, mentioned that Emergency Planning for the Peninsula is ongoing, but still in its infancy. The LIC is represented at those meetings and will continue to be involved. He thanked the membership for their willingness to help, and especially appreciated the help with moving the tables and chairs for Key Fest.

SECRETARY

Jan Prichard, Secretary, read a thank you note from the Key Peninsula Veterans for the use of our chairs for the Memorial Day Ceremony in May. She asked that the minutes of the previous meeting be approved. A motion to approve was made, seconded and passed.

OLD BUSINESS

Geoff announced that the floating restroom for the marina would not be happening this year, but that we will try for next year if state funds become available.

NEW BUSINESS

The ice freezer at the dock is up for approval. The Board made a tentative okay for the used freezer to be purchased from Denise Hayes. It is a \$600 item to be used for ice at the marina. There has been ice at the marina in times past with mixed results, and the marina committee has promised there would be a management plan for stocking it through the summer and dealing with any money collection problems that might arise. A motion was made and seconded and passed to buy the machine for \$600.

Sandy Black mentioned that Mr. Young, owner of the Shell station, has been providing ice for free for our events for years. It's a lot of work and very generous of him to do so. Kurt will send him a thank you note. We will buy our ice from Mr. Young for the new ice machine.

Geoff talked about the Dayna Hanson proposal to use the LIC building and grounds to make a feature film and asked for the members' thoughts on that idea. Comments from the members were favorable. She would not be filming during the Labor Day Dance as she had first proposed. The Board will continue negotiations with her and sort out issues such as risk, liability and cost, and get out the information to the members by email and on the website

OTHER BUSINESS

Carolyn Wiley said there are about 200 photos from the Croquet Tournament on the LIC Facebook page. Francie said that we will probably have proceeds of around \$1800 to give to Community in Schools after all the bills have been paid.

Mark Runions commended the club members on their spirit of helpfulness and commerarderie, in evidence at our meetings and at the Croquet Tournament. He asked for members to be thinking how they can help out at Beyond the Borders and encouraged everyone to come and to invite their neighbors and spread the word. The first band will be a steel band from Trinidad, followed by Russian folk music, a Latin American folk trio and a drum circle. The leader of the drum circle is Jeff Johns and who is an amazing instructor and motivator and there will be time after the drum circle performance for audience members to try their hand at drumming with his guidance. There will be a beer garden, Hawaiian food, nachos, brauts and great desserts all at affordable prices.

Pat Thompson, dock master, announced we are averaging about 30 boat visitors per week and we've had two yacht clubs as well. A car crashed down there last week which took out our power for awhile and Virgil Iverson had some vandalism done to the gas tank on his boat. Last week a boat came in to do free pump outs, and only had four takers.
