LIC General Meeting June 19, 2019

Clark Van Bogart, president, called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. He welcomed new and/or renewing members Bonnie Eads, Jen Dalton, Laurie Austin and Babette Cool, and a guest, his grandson, Dylan Van Bogart. Dick Van Cise was present and we wished him a happy 85th birthday.

BOARD REPORTS

Secretary: Jane Eiseman asked that the minutes of the May meeting be accepted as written and submitted. MSP.

Treasurer: Jim Hettinger noted that May was a very good month for the LIC. Net profit for the Memorial Day Dance came in at \$600 over budgeted amount, and the Dock Breakfast about \$950 over budgeted amount. Building and Grounds and the Marina are also over budgeted net profit.

Vice President: Marsha Kremen stated that she had attended the Preservation Board meeting to assess the grant applications. The LIC grant application scored second overall out of 25. She will attend the County Council meeting to find out if they approve the monies. The purpose of our grant is to hire a structural engineer to assess the load limits of the LIC clubhouse, with regard to a new roof and/or insulation.

President: Clark reported that the windows for the west side of the building, being refurbished, are in a warehouse in Tacoma and may be delivered next week.



The LIC and TLF are co-sponsors of the Key Pen Parks 4th of July celebration at Gateway Park. You can go from the Home parade, with pancakes served, to the park, where hotdogs will be served.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Membership: Nancy Carr had nothing to report.

Events:

- Bob Green announced that 265 people attended the Memorial Day Dance. The band was a huge success. Tickets were sold at Sunnycrest Nursery, Blend and the Marina. Tips amounted to \$204 and 137 LIC Bucks were redeemed.
- We will again have and LIC/TLF float in the 4th of July parade in Home. The float will be decorated on site at 8 a.m. in the 4th. Kelly Hettinger urged members to come and bring candy and water balloons to throw to onlookers.
- The Labor Day Dance is coming up.

Marina:

- Jim Hettinger declared that the kayak racks are up at the Marina, with a launch just a few feet away. The rate is \$25/month and there are four slots remaining.
