

President's Message

As discussed at the February membership meeting, the LIC is moving forward with more specific plans for memorials to Geoff Baillie at the marina and the clubhouse. At the marina, the memorial will include naming of the new walkway as the Geoffrey L. Baillie Memorial Wharf, hopefully in time to include a dedication ceremony in the Dock Breakfast activities in May. Also at the February meeting, we announced the launch of the Geoff Baillie Memorial Fund, with any donations in excess of actual memorial costs to be added to the already existing memorial fund in Geoff's name at Evergreen Elementary School. More information appears elsewhere in this newsletter and I urge all members to consider a donation.

We are facing a new problem, which is that our existing heater units in the clubhouse main room are failing. One of the units is not working at all and the other one is failing. The membership (wisely, in my opinion) has voted to approach this problem by reconsidering what a better heating plan for the building might involve. By the time you read this, we will have met with one or more heating experts to determine our best options and may be on our way to having a warmer clubhouse during the cold months.

The membership is in for a treat at the March 20th meeting. Our program will be "Bad Boys of McNeil" presented by historians Joan Curtis and David Dilgard. This will deal with some of the notorious past residents of the McNeil Island Federal Prison, including Charles Manson, Robert Stroud (The Birdman of Alcatraz), Alvin Karpis, Roy Gardner and Frederick Emerson Peters. LONGBRANCH IMPROVEMENT CLUB GENERAL MEETING MINUTES FEBRUARY 20, 2013

Gayle Brewer, President, called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Francie introduced Terry Stewart, Dave Dahl's son-in-law.

Secretary: In Peg Bingham's absence, Jan Prichard asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the January General Meeting. A motion was made seconded and approved.

Treasurer: Francie Carr, Treasurer, drew our attention to copies of the Profit and Loss statement on the tables. The Colberts have collected \$131 for the scholarship fund by recycling our collected pop cans. Marina expenses are high because the next nine months of insurance have just been paid.

Events: Tim Heitzman, Events Chair, reported that the Pancake Breakfast was a great event with a great turn out. People were greeted at the door and non members were all invited to join the LIC. Five new members signed up. He thanked many members who helped out. Tim told us Dave Montesino was at the event and posted pictures and a write up about the breakfast on his blog about life in Longbranch. Dave is an excellent writer and photographer and there is a link to his blog on the LIC website, <u>www.licweb.org</u>. Dave did the picture of the Longbranch Marina that is on our website.

Membership: Jan Prichard, Membership Chair, reported that we have 86 paid memberships in 2013 making a total of 146 members so far for the year. Members were reminded that it is time to pay their yearly dues if they have not already done so. Jan also thanked the hostesses for the evening, Theresa Gano, Robin Gould and Ann Dearing.

Marina: Harry Faas, Marina Chair, asked for volunteers to be "ice runners" for the marina. We did well selling ice to guest boaters last season and Lynn Carr, Dock Master, needs a list of folks he can call on who might be able to fetch more ice when supply is low at the dock. Volunteers would get hours for their time and are asked to call anyone on the Marina Committee or Lynn to get on the volunteer list.

Newsletter: Nancy Carr, Newsletter Editor, asked for submissions for the newsletter which goes out next week.

President: Gayle Brewer, President, reminded us that Joan Curtis from the Steilacoom Historical Society will be making a presentation at our March meeting on "The Bad Boys of McNeil".

Old Business: Gayle brought us up to date on the planning for memorials to Geoff Bailey at the marina and the clubhouse. The board proposed that there be a plaque at the marina naming the wharf for Geoff and also have another plaque at the clubhouse in his memory. Of all the proposals made for memorials these were the ones, that for various reasons, seemed the most appropriate to the Board. A motion was made and seconded to approve those recommendation. There was a lot of discussion about types of plaques, costs and placement. At the wharf, the intent is to create an interpretive plaque, enamel on heavy steel, that allows us to tell the story of how the wharf came into being and why we're naming the wharf for Geoff. After many questions and comments the motion to adopt the Board's proposals were unanimously accepted.

The "Geoff Baillie Memorial Fund" was the next topic for discussion. Francie said she could establish an account only for that fund and any money donated would be used only for Geoff's memorials. Any money collected over and above the amount needed to pay for the plaques would then be donated to the memorial fund at Evergreen Elementary set up by Geoff's family. A motion was made, seconded and passed to establish the Geoff Baillie Memorial Fund. Francie accepted donations that evening and said checks mailed to the clubhouse should designate "memorial fund". Also, she can accept Visa payments over the phone. Call her at (253)564-4065.

Barb Van Bogart announced that the "Name the Cookbook Contest" deadline has been extended to April 1st and she showed us the wonderful basket full of goodies that is the prize for the contest winner. So far about 130 recipes have been submitted and they'd like to get 70 more before the cookbook committee meets again in March. She encouraged us to submit our recipes and to solicit recipes from all the good cooks in our acquaintance.

Phil Johnson reported that the water at the marina is run by an informal water association that was originally formed to serve the now defunct Chowder House and the few surrounding residences. Mike Hays, who has been managing the water system for years, had been meeting with Geoff to begin formalizing the association to decide such things as what percentage of the water bill everyone would pay and to establish a fund to take care of needed maintenance and repairs. A committee from the LIC will be meeting with Mike to continue working toward this goal. They will report back to the members at the March General Meeting.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES February 20, 2013 (continued)

New Business: Gayle reported that the Board heard from Doug Lewis, Building and Grounds Chair, that one heater in the main room is out and the other is going out. These are very old units and would be impractical to repair. Doug did get two quotes for replacement and some ideas for enhancing the heating efficiency in the main room. To replace the existing units with newer 200,000 btu units would cost around \$7,100. However, both companies who came to look at our system suggested that our gas lines might not be the right size and neither would want to replace the heaters without fixing any gas line problems that might exist. We could choose to put in 250,000 or 300,000 btu units for additional cost. Another approach would be to ask the experts what their recommendations would be if we were to assume we were starting from scratch to bring heating to the building. Because we depend on good heat in order to rent out and use the building we will need to make some decisions as soon as possible. Francie reported that we have capital improvement funds of approximately \$25,000 for the building. This is separate from the fund set aside for the roof. After much discussion, Denny Prichard made a motion that the membership authorize the Board to decide, on the basis of further research, what heating system should be installed and to spend an amount not to exceed \$15,000. The motion was seconded and passed.

Denny Prichard reported that our taxes for the marina went up significantly with the building of the new wharf. He and Clark Van Bogart are looking into options for reducing that tax burden.

Kurt Anderson passed out a list of Geoff's tools that Lynn Larson would like to see purchased by people who knew Geoff and might like to own some of these items. If you would like an item on the list, please contact Kurt, not Lynn. These items are available only to LIC members at this time. If you are interested in the Boston Whaler, it is at Kurt's house and you should contact him. The Newport 28 sailboat is at the marina and to see it contact Kurt or Lynn Carr, Dockmaster.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:45.
