#### **Final President's Message**



This is will be my final message as president of the LIC. At our membership meeting on June 21st, we'll be replacing about half of our board as part of that election. We'll also be serving members a terrific barbecue dinner and thanking you all heartily for the volunteer hours, heart and spunk you've provided to make the LIC the LIC.

It's important to think back on what being a member of the Longbranch Improvement Club provides you. Top on my list is that we provide community. We have an historic clubhouse to recreate in and offer up to the public as a rental for key gatherings. We have a network of forested trails and streams anyone, not just members, can enjoy. Thanks to the energy of David Shinners, we also offer a

community garden that is shaping up to be a space we can also enjoy, grow delicious food and possibly serve as another community space to rent out. There's our huge field that has served as a space for so many things – rummage sales, car shows and in years past baseball games. Finally, we own one of the friendliest and most picturesque marinas in the entire Puget Sound.

What I'm trying to say is it's a privilege to be an LIC member. It's an honor to serve on our board. We are 102 years old now and have proudly served the community that entire time. This has been one of my chief priorities these last two years, to focus squarely on being a community resource and start nudging the LIC back to being more social as it was in years past, especially in the wake of the pandemic.

Have we succeeded? I think we are well on our way to that goal and I expect our new board will continue this task. We also established TGIF as a monthly event, that's been a steady source of new members, and passed a 5-Year-Plan that gives us a very clear roadmap to continued success.

#### This is Goal Number One from the 5-Year-Plan:

Create fun, desirable and highly utilized community gathering spaces where people feel safe and connected.

There is no doubt in my mind we are doing this. We call these five spaces the Clubhouse, the Forest, the Community Garden, the Field and the Marina. And to maintain and use all of them, we have to have dedicated volunteers, something I know I go on and on about. But we don't survive as an organization without this volunteerism, and that goes from helping to weed around the clubhouse to serving on the board. We live and die by our volunteers.

To that end, as president, we also expanded our zipcode areas so you can live from Key Center south all the way to the edges of Victor and enjoy regular membership status – plus the benefits that come with it such a discounts and getting a slip at the marina if you wish. And you get all of this for just 15 volunteer hours a year and attending three membership meetings in person.

What's next for me is that I'll be putting money where my mouth is. I'll continue volunteering. The board elected me the Trustee-at-Large for the next two years so I'll be helping guide the LIC – and likely fundraising – as we tackle our next two biggest and costliest challenges: Finishing the roof project and replacing docks to meet the Department of Natural Resources standards.

I also plan to help the events committee. While our 5-Year-Plan pushes us to become a more social organization, that means we need bodies to help make these events successful, such as TGIF and our new Open Mic Night. And I have other ideas up my sleeve. What about a Farmer's Market in our field every couple of week to sell/trade vegetables and other possible

rummage items? How about outdoor movies during the warmer months... maybe even starting this summer?

Meeting was called to order at 7:15PM

#### Membership

Membership will upload your attendance, so it is very important to check in when attending meetings. The check-in sheet is printed in alphabetical order according to first name. The attendee list for March 2023 is not usable, so membership will send out an email asking for you to confirm if you attended that meeting or not, please be sure to respond so you get credit if you attended. Please be sure to add your volunteer hours to Track It Forward as it is not possible for us to migrate your 2023 hours from Neon into Track It Forward. If you receive an email with a link to sign up for an event, and respond through the link that you are volunteering, those hours will automatically be entered into Track It Forward. If you have not downloaded the Track It Forward app, you may consider doing so as it provides an easy way to enter your volunteer hours. If you have a household membership, and only use one email, instead of a separate one for each person, and both people volunteer the same amount of hours, you can enter double hours with a note stating more than one person volunteered. At this time, we have paused work with the contractors while a new leadership team reviews the plans and tries to find ways to reduce the expected costs related to replacing the roof. This project remains a top priority.

The LIC also has a significant amount of work that needs to be completed at the marina by 2030 to satisfy DNR requirements. This may seem like ample time to get that work done, however, this project is also costly and we need the time for raising adequate funds.
